Rayan puts his name in the container to show he is in school and then he sits quietly on his carpet space, ready to listen to the teacher.



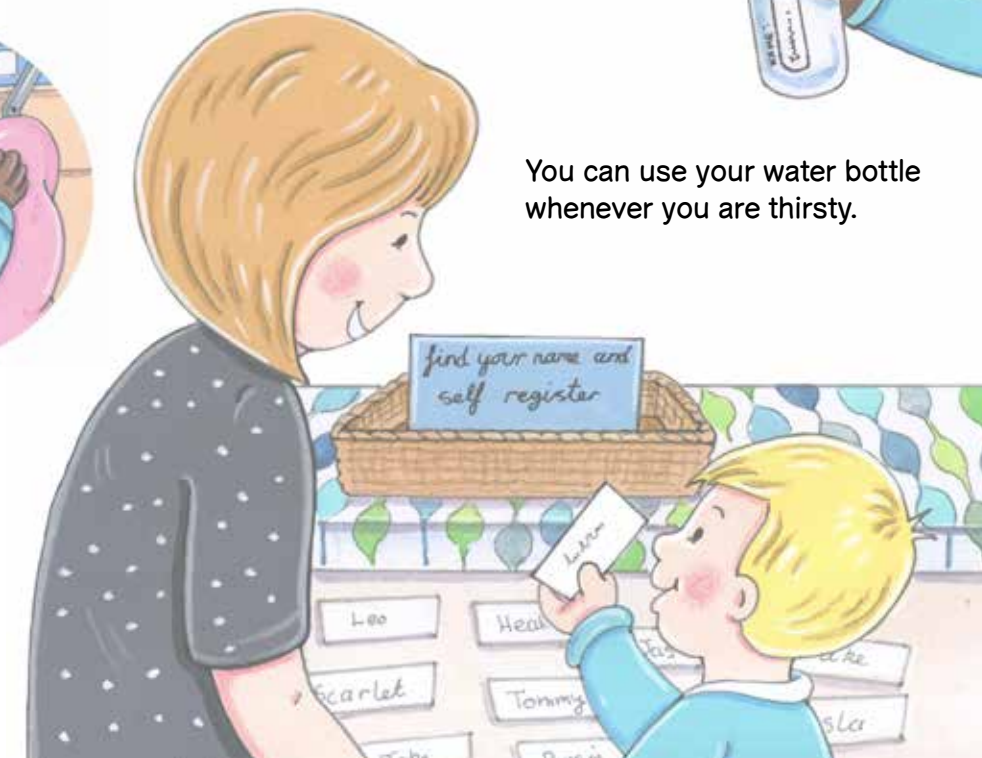
In EY2, Amani has found her name, so she knows where to hang her coat.

What will I do in EY2?

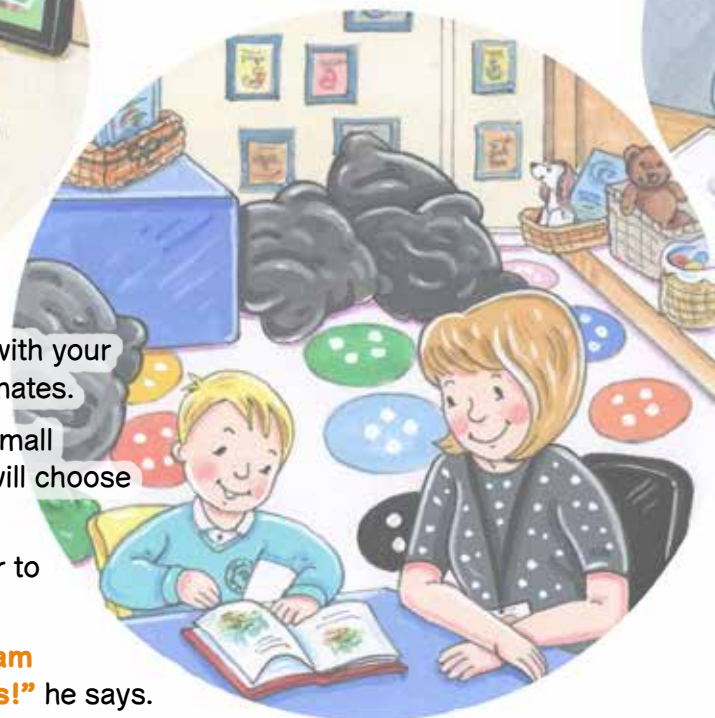
Excellence

Amani is drawing a picture of her brother.

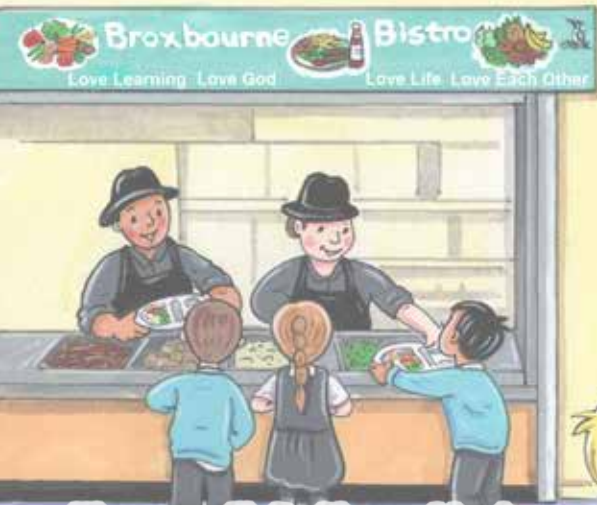


William is enjoying looking at a book with his teacher.

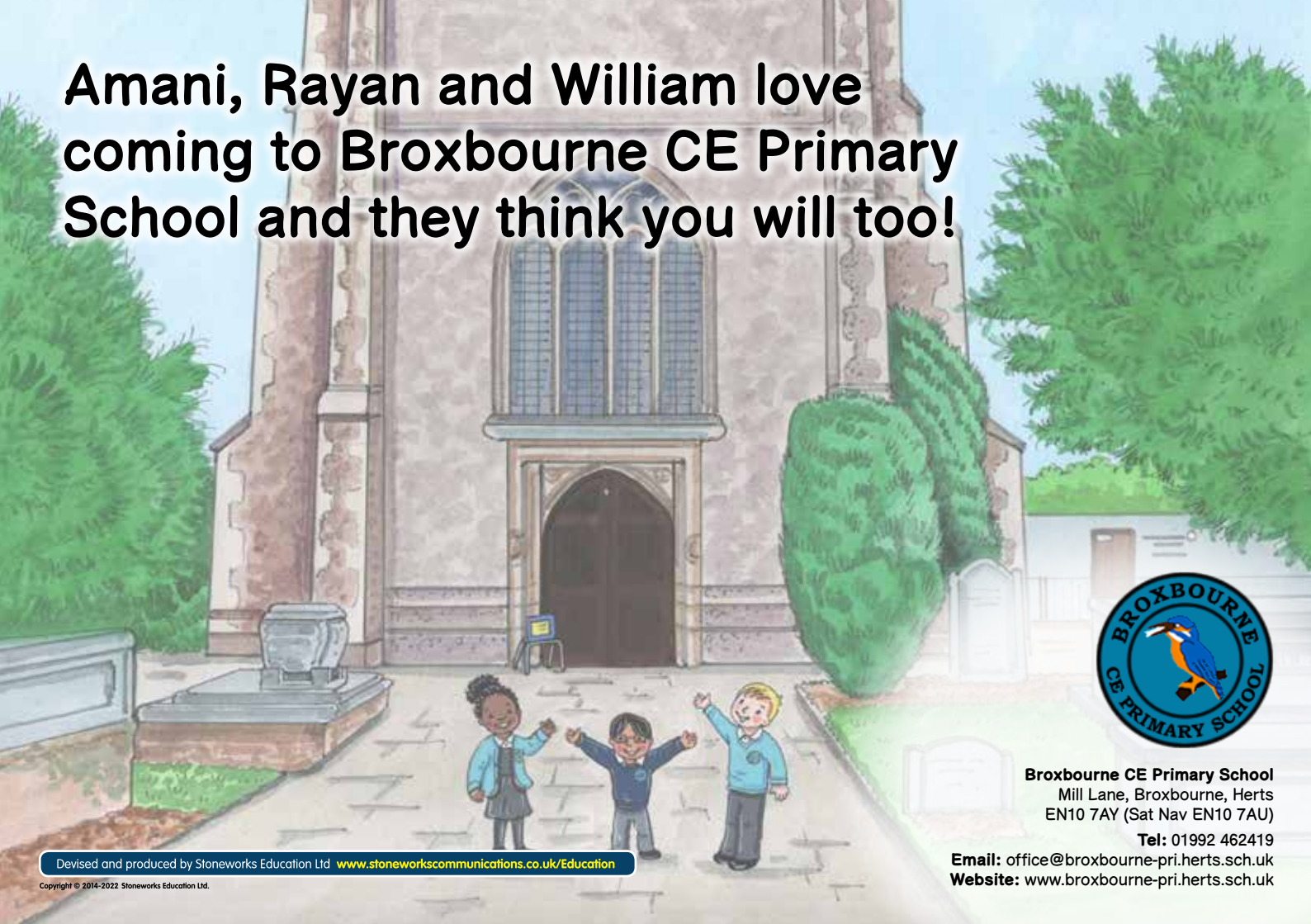
Rayan has used the toilet and remembered to flush.
