





# What happens when I get to school?






When you are inside, you will hang your coat and bag on the peg with your name on it.

You will wear your green overall underneath your coat and keep it on all day to keep your uniform clean.






#### What will I do in school?

You will have lots of fun while you learn. There will be some activities that you will do with your teacher, such as learning to read and write. Mae and Thomas are learning numbers with their teacher.




Now Aarav is practising his handwriting. "Look, I can write my name," he says.

"I'm pleased it's fish fingers today because that's my favourite meal," says Jack.


Everyone is polite and uses their knife and fork. If you need any help, there will be kind adults and buddies to help you.

"I'm glad I practised going to the toilet by myself before I started school because it is so easy now," he says.


Don't worry if you need help or have an accident, just let your teacher know.
