The toilets are in the classroom and you can go anytime you need to. During story time, remember to put your hand up so your teacher knows you need to go. You will go to the toilet by yourself, but if you need any help, just tell your teacher.

"I am glad that I practised going to the toilet before I started school," he says to himself.

He feels very confident using the toilet by himself.

Max has been to the toilet. He has flushed and now he is washing his hands with warm water and soap and will then dry them.
