


Charlotte and her new friends are drawing shapes and letters with their teacher's help.

# What happens if I need the toilet?




You can go to the toilet when you need to, but you must first tell your teacher.

"Yes, of course," says her teacher. "We will see you back here soon."




Charlotte goes to the toilet. When she has finished, she makes sure she flushes to leave the toilet nice and clean for the next child who will use it.

When it is time to go home, you will collect your coat and belongings.


We will then take you to your after-school club, or your teacher will then take you outside for your grownup to collect you.
