What happens when I get to school?

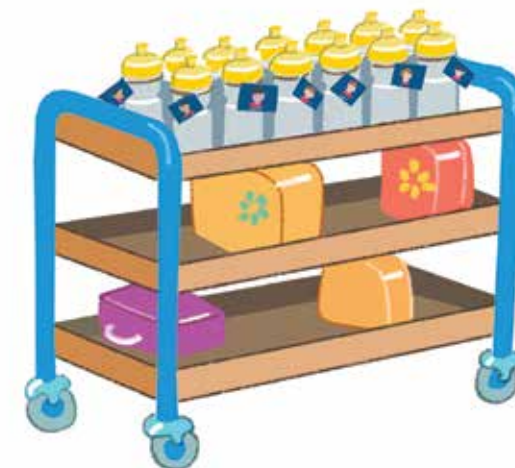
When you arrive in your school classroom, your grown-up will join in an activity with you to help you get settled. Then you will say goodbye to your grown-up.

During the morning, you will have a snack of fresh fruit to eat, and water or milk to drink.

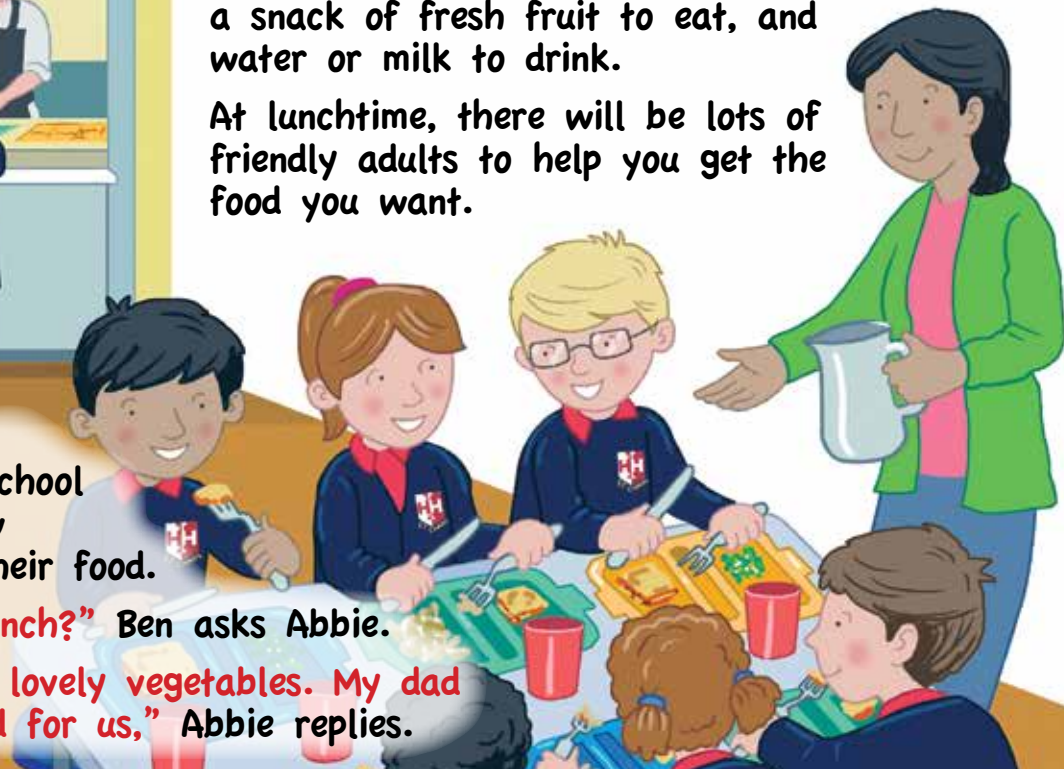
At lunchtime, there will be lots of friendly adults to help you get the food you want.

"We grow them in our garden, just like Jack!"

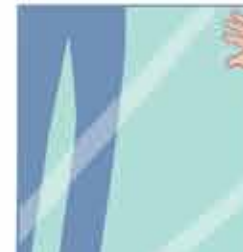
Everybody laughs!
