What happens when I come to school?



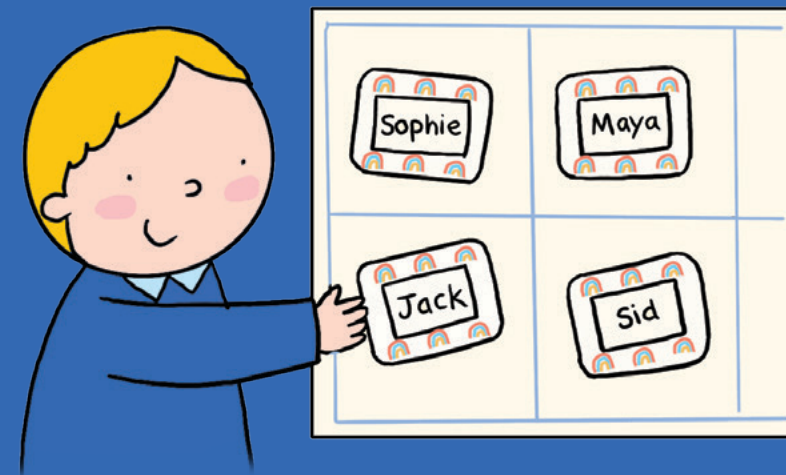
Your grown-ups will drop you off at the early years and KS1 playground. If you go to breakfast club, a teacher will bring you to the classroom.

"Good morning, Sophie," says the teacher. **"We are going to have lots of fun today!"**

Then you will go to the cloakroom area and put your coat and bag on the hook with your name on, just like Sophie is doing. Then you will put your water bottle in the tray, just like Maya.



Next, you will go through to the classroom and self-register by finding the card with your name on and sticking it on the chart on the wall, just like Jack is doing. If you want to, you can also do the emotion chart so the grown-ups in school know how you are feeling that day.



Then you will all sit on the carpet. Your teacher will check who is in school that day and help you choose what you would like for lunch.

You will do lots of fun activities in your classroom and outdoors. You will do some activities on the carpet, learning with your teacher, and some activities in smaller groups or by yourself.

During 'choosing time', you and your friends will get to explore whichever area of the classroom you like.

Maya is in the writing area, practising writing letters.



Sophie and Jack are playing superheroes in the small world area together.

"Quick, Sophie! We need to rescue all these people," says Jack.

"Super Sophie to the rescue!" says Sophie.

Outside, you can also play with the mud kitchen, sand and water as well as role-play.

The children are playing in the large construction area outside.

"Let's build a house," says Jack.

"I've got some wood we can use," says Sophie.



"You can load it into my truck," says Maya. "I'll deliver it for you."

All the activities are lots of fun and you will learn as you play.

You will quickly get to know the other children in your class and make friends.

What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?

You will have a snack in the morning. You can choose to have fruit or vegetables. While you are eating your snack, you and your friends will sit together on the carpet and listen to a story.

"I'm going to have a crunchy apple," says Maya.

"I've got a juicy pear," says Jack.
"It's delicious."

If you are thirsty, you can have a drink from your water bottle whenever you need to and there is also a drinking fountain in the cloakroom.



At lunchtime, you and your friends will wash your hands and go to the hall with your teacher.

If you have brought a packed lunch from home, you can go and sit down straight away. If you are having a cooked meal, you will collect your meal and then sit at a table with your friends.

Everyone uses good table manners and is polite and kind.

After you have finished eating, you can play outside.

What happens when I need to go to the toilet?

The toilets are just outside the classroom. Remember to ask your teacher before you go.

Your grown-ups will make sure that you have lots of practice going by yourself before you start school.

Sophie has been to the toilet and remembered to flush. Now she is washing her hands carefully with soap and warm water.

"I'm washing my hands really well so I don't spread any germs," she says.



She makes sure she dries them properly before going back to the classroom.

If you have an accident or need help, tell your teacher. Your grown-ups will leave some spare clothes in school in case you need them. The school also have lots of spare underwear and clothes in case of an accident.

When it is home time, a grown-up will help you collect your coat and bag from the cloakroom.

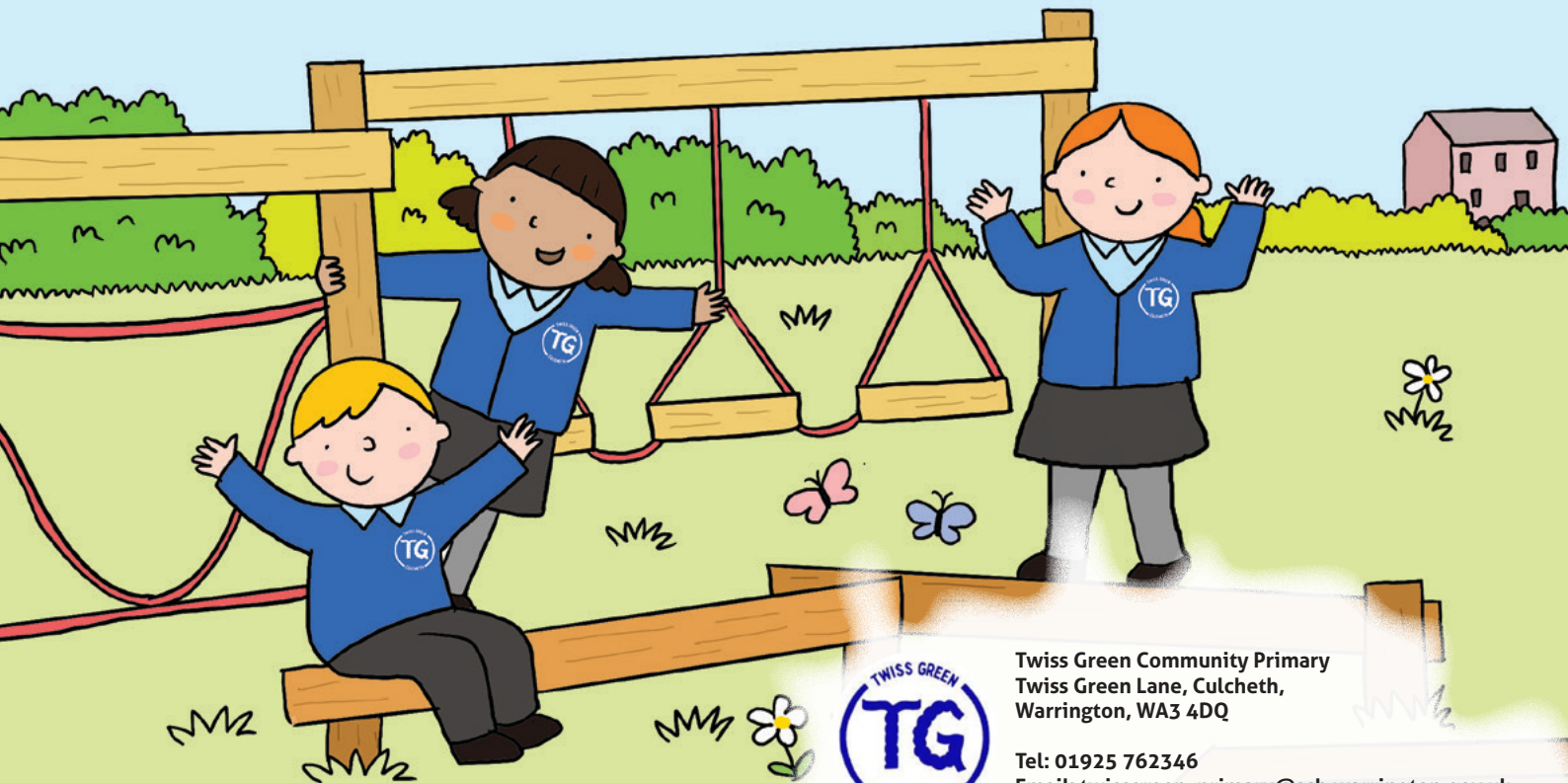
When your teacher sees your grown-up waiting outside, they will call your name and you can go.
