School day: settling in

School hours

Our school day begins at 9.00am, with the gates opening at 8.45am and ends at 3.30pm. Nursery starts at 8.45am.

Wraparound

We run a breakfast club from 7.45am and after-school provision until 6.00pm.

Food in school

All our food is freshly prepared on site. Our menu is carefully planned to offer a main course, a vegetarian main course and lighter lunch options, plus a salad bar, dessert, fruit and bread.

Uniform

Our uniform policy is robustly followed. It is simple, affordable, practical and obligatory from Reception Class onwards (it is optional in Nursery). We want children to be comfortable, smart and to take pride in wearing our school logo.

Trips and visitors

At St Richard's we aim to supplement the children's learning with a wide range of experiences, trips and visitors. These encompass a broad spectrum of areas. For example, over the course of their time at our school, children will visit local and London art galleries and museums, a West End show, local parks and outdoor spaces and will spend a day at the seaside. In Key Stage 2 they will have spent a night in our school hall, on the school field, in a tepee at Thames Young Mariners and will have been invited to attend a residential trip at an activitiy centre.

In addition, children will have had the opportunity to visit and sometimes perform in major concert venues such as The O2 and The Royal Albert Hall as well as performing at local singing events such as Ham Fair and local music festivals.

Music

St Richard's has a noble history of music at the school, dating back to the 1970's when the choir shared a stage with Cilla Black and Sir Harry Secombe and appeared on BBC's Pebble Mill and performed at the Royal Albert Hall. More recently, the choir performed at the O2 arena and the Royal Albert Hall. At Christmas time, the children participate in a number of local events including singing at local care homes, department stores and Christmas markets. The children very much enjoy performing and music plays a large part in our school life.

Music at St Richard's covers a range of musical skills within all year groups exploring the various musical elements including pulse, rhythm and pitch. Pupils will have the opportunity to learn at least one musical instrument and perform in a variety of settings. Music has no boundaries and is inclusive and accessible for all. We believe music can support positive mental health, provide a platform for expressing emotions and brings our community together.

P.E.

The intent of our P.E. (Physical Education) curriculum is to provide all children with high quality P.E. and sport provision which develops their skills in both the short and long term. Our vision is for every pupil to succeed and achieve their potential as well as to lead physically active lifestyles.

Through our teaching of P.E., we aim to provide opportunities for all pupils to develop values and transferable life skills such as fairness and respect as well as providing them with opportunities to take part in competitive sport.



Admissions and getting involved

Admissions

Applying for a place at school can be a little confusing and we hope this will be of help. There are four distinct phases for admissions:

- 1. Entry to our afternoon playgroup provision called Acorns, for children who are 2 4 years old.
- 2. Entry to our Nursery Class for children who have turned 3 years old by the start of the academic year in September.
- 3. Entry to our Reception Class for children who have turned 4 years old by the start of the academic year in September (even if your child is already in our Nursery Class you will need to apply via the local authority for a place in our Reception Class). Contact www.eadmissions.org
