# What happens when I get to school?

Now he is washing his hands with warm water and soap and he will dry them before he goes back to the classroom.

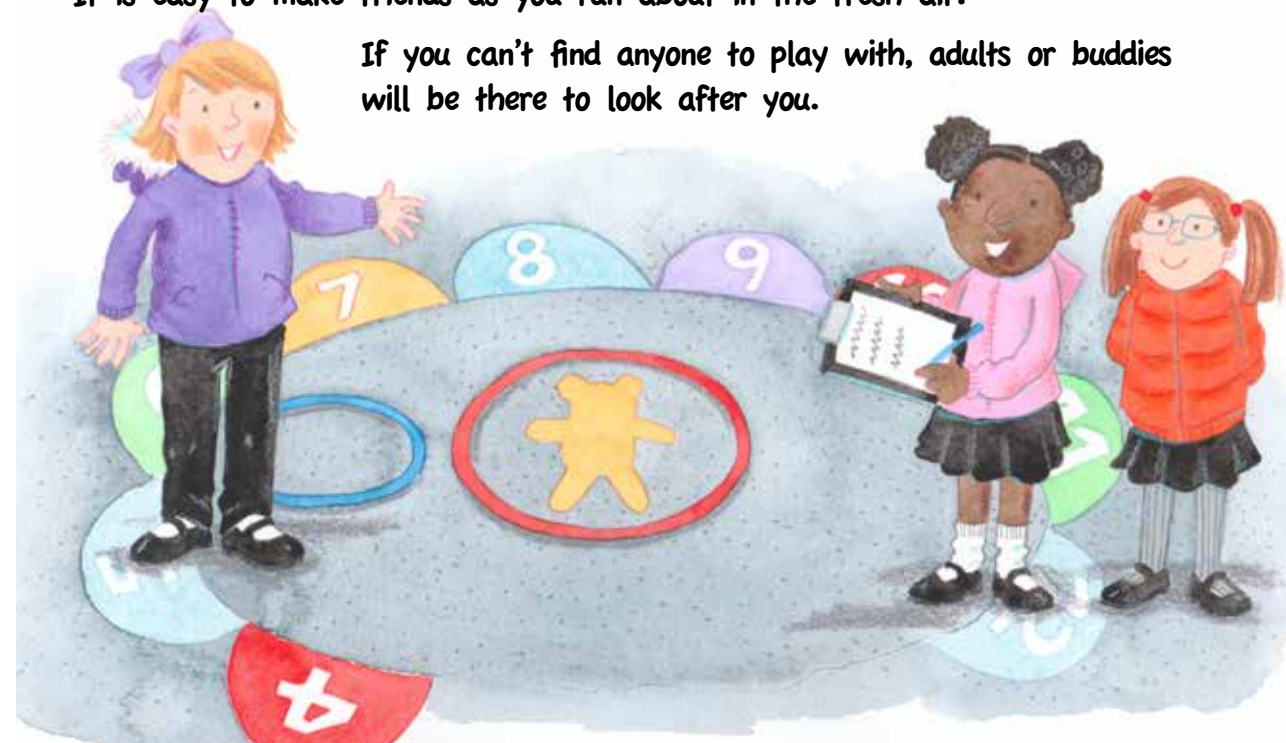


If you have an accident, don't worry. Just let an adult know and they will help.

# What happens If I am hungry or thirsty?

You can have a snack and a drink in the morning at playtime. You can bring a snack, such as fruit, from home.

You can use your water bottle whenever you are thirsty.

At lunchtime, your teacher will give you a wrist band which matches the colour meal you chose.

Your teacher will take you to the dinner hall. There are lots of kind adults there who will take care of you.

Yellow and green meals are served from one side of the hall, and blue from the other. You will line up on the side which matches your band.

You can also get healthy snacks to have with your school meal from Ollie's trolley.

When you have collected your meal, you will sit at a table with your friends.

If you are having a packed lunch, you will bring your lunch box into the hall and sit with your friends.



The food is delicious and healthy. You will use a knife, fork and spoon and everyone uses good table manners, so it is a good idea to practise at home before you start school.

The adults will make sure that you have enough time to finish it and will encourage you to eat as much as you can, so you have lots of energy for the rest of the afternoon.



When you have finished, you will clear your plate away and make sure the table is tidy.

# What happens at the end of the day?

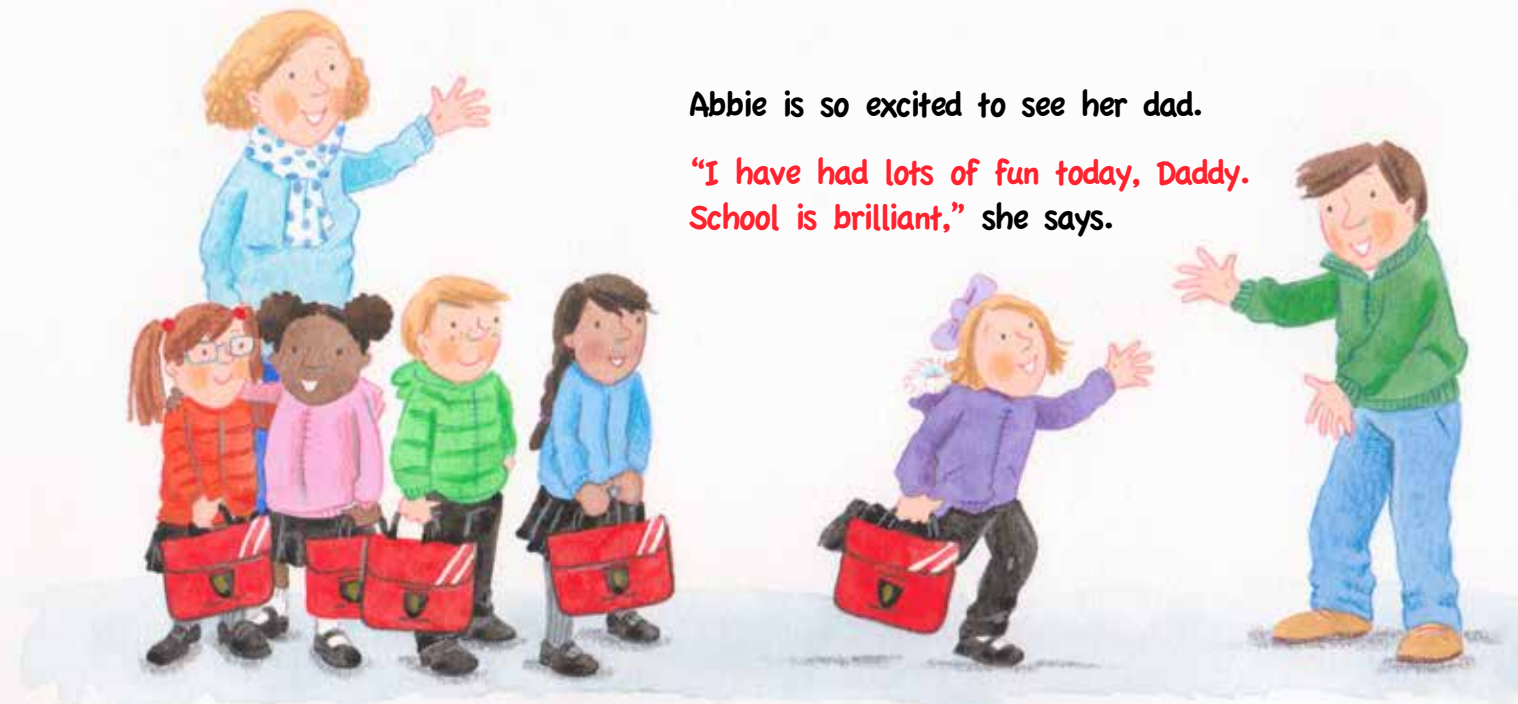


At the end of the day, you will sit on the carpet and might sing some songs or listen to your teacher read a story.
