You will sit on the carpet with the rest of the children. Your teacher will check who is in school today.

What will I do at school?

There are lots of fun activities to do at school. You will learn and make friends as you play. Sometimes you will do activities with your teacher and sometimes you will choose what you do.

What happens when I need to go to the toilet?



You can use the toilet whenever you need to, but remember to tell your teacher when you go.

You will go by yourself but if you have a visual impairment, your teacher will help you find the toilets until you know your way around.

"Everything is just the right size for me," says Farah. "It is so easy to use!"

She remembers to flush when she has finished and now she is washing her hands with warm water and soap.

"I am glad I practised using the toilet by myself," she says. "Now I don't need any help when I go."



What if I am hungry or thirsty?



You can use your water bottle whenever you are thirsty.

In the morning, you can eat a healthy snack from home which your grown-ups will give you. You will have your snack at playtime.

Ben and Sam are having their snack outside.

Ben has eaten his banana already.



You will collect your meal from the serving area and sit at a table to eat with your friends.

Ben has asked for help getting a drink, so a kind adult has brought him one.

Everyone clears up after themselves when they have finished their meal. The adults will show you where everything goes.



What happens at the end of the school day?

At the end of the day, just before home time, you will sit on the carpet with your friends. Sometimes your teacher will read you a story or you may chat about what you have learnt that day. Today, everyone is singing a song and shaking maracas.


"I love singing this song," says Ben.
