When the school day starts, you will sit on the mat. Your teacher will check who is in that day and then you can go and play.

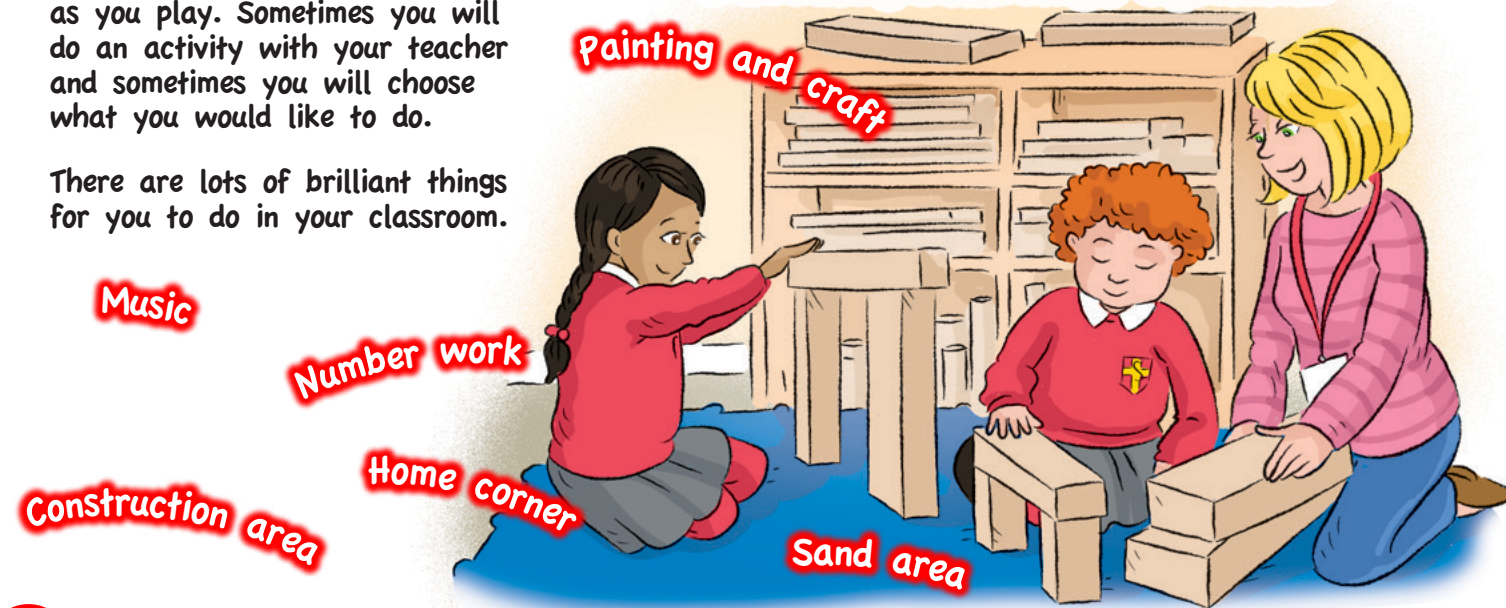
You will learn and make friends as you play. Sometimes you will do an activity with your teacher and sometimes you will choose what you would like to do.

There are lots of brilliant things for you to do in your classroom.

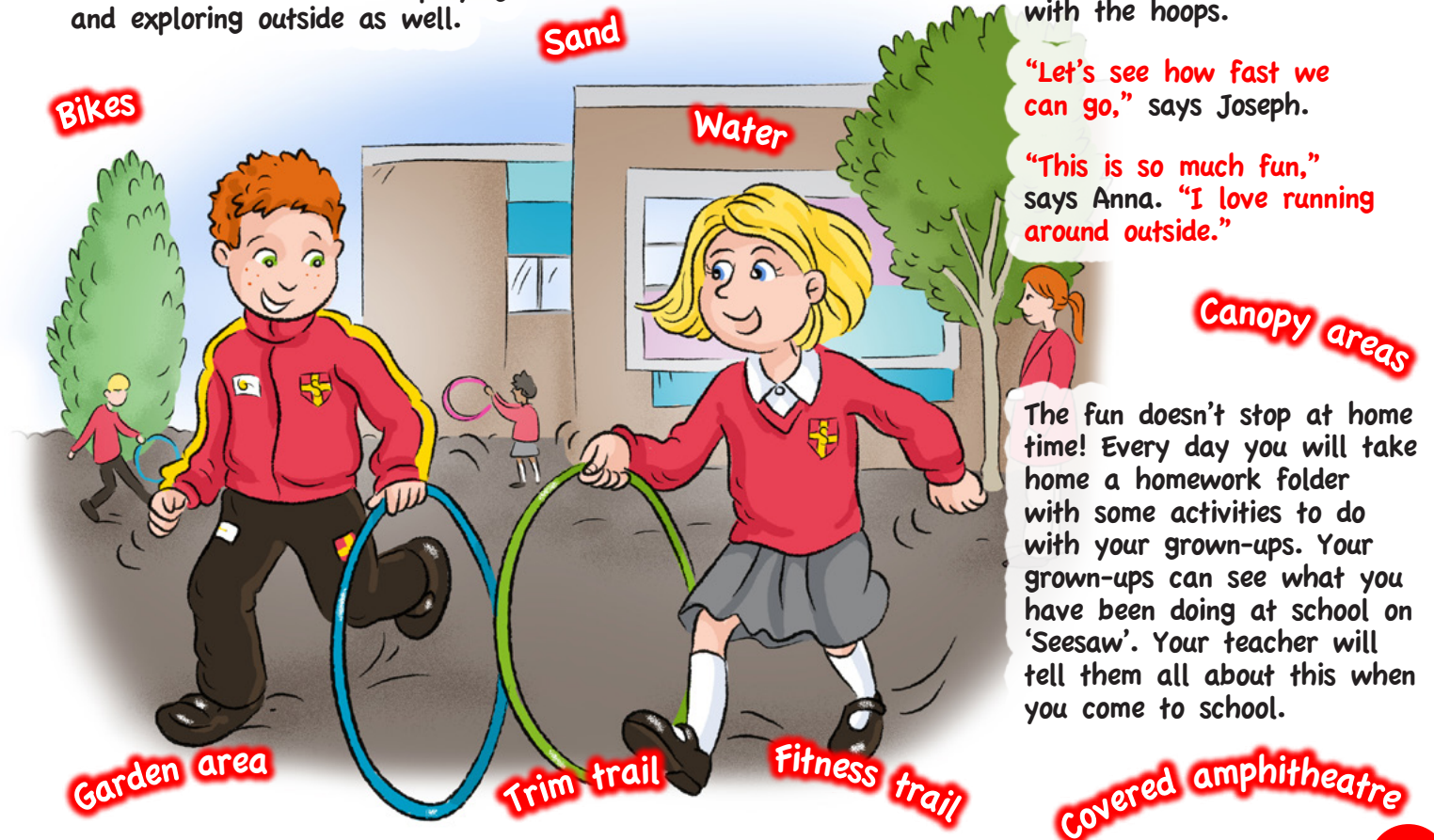
Fatima is playing with the blocks. Andrew and their teacher are playing too.
