What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?



If you are thirsty, water will be available for you at all times.

You will also have a snack and a drink of milk. Before you eat, you will wash your hands. You will say a prayer in Welsh to thank God for the lovely food you are going to have. Sometimes you will sit at a table or on the carpet, or sometimes outside if the weather is nice.

What happens if I need the toilet?



The toilets are within the classroom.

You can go to the toilet whenever you need to, and you will go by yourself. Just put your hand up to let your teacher know, like Megan is doing.

Megan has been to the toilet and flushed when she finished. Now she is washing her hands with soap and water.

"I am glad that Mummy and Daddy help me practise going to the toilet by myself," she says. She feels very happy that she knows how to do it all by herself. She knows that if she needs help or has an accident, she can ask an adult.

Her grown-ups have brought some spare clothes into Nursery if she needs them.



Who will look after me at Nursery?

We are all very kind at All Saints' and we will look after you.

We will help you learn and make Nursery a wonderful, happy place.

Mr Hatwood looks after all the children and adults at school.

Miss Williams looks after the children and adults in Nursery. You will also have other adults that will help you.

We can't wait to meet you.



Who else will help me at school?

We do lots of activities with All Saints' Church. Father Tudor is very kind and will visit you in Nursery and tell you stories from the Bible. He will talk to you about God. He also helps look after us all in school to keep it a friendly and loving place.

We hope that you will be kind to your new friends in Nursery too.



What happens at the end of my Nursery session?



When your session at Nursery has nearly ended, you will sit on the carpet with your friends. An adult will read a story. Before you leave, you will talk about your time in Nursery and share what you have enjoyed doing.

The children are being shown the storybook and asked to describe what the weather is like.

Then you will collect your coat and belongings and line up.



If you are going straight to Playgroup after Nursery, an adult will collect you.

If you are going home, an adult will take you outside to meet your grown-ups.

“Hello, Dad,” says Rhys. “I have had lots of fun today. I can’t wait to come back tomorrow!”
