What happens when I come into nursery?

Your grown-up will take you to the classroom door.
Teachers and teaching assistants will be there to welcome you.

Thara smiles, she likes it when the teachers use the Welsh language.



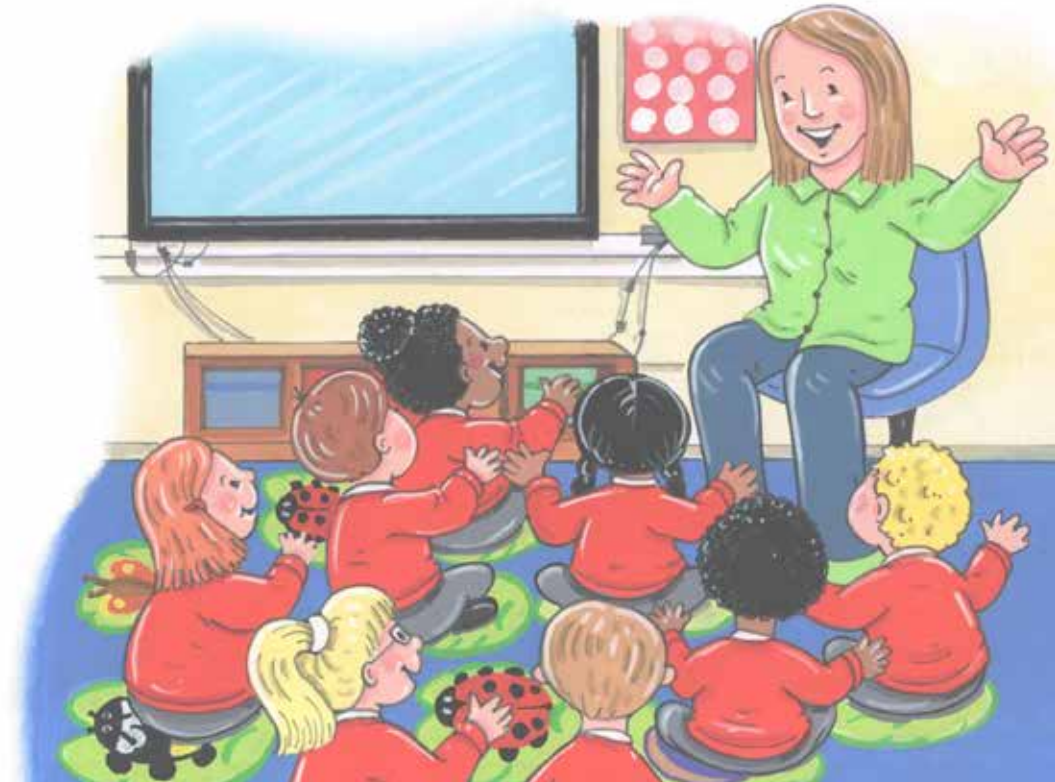
You will hang up your coat,

Welsh language songs.

What will I do in nursery?

You will learn and make friends while you play. Sometimes your teacher will lead the activity, and sometimes you will choose.

There are lots of activities to choose from, both indoors and outdoors.

What if I am hungry or thirsty?

In the morning, you will prepare your own fruit or vegetable snack and have a drink of milk or water. Adults will be there to help you.

"Dw i'n hoffi afalau," says Dylan, which means 'I like apples'.

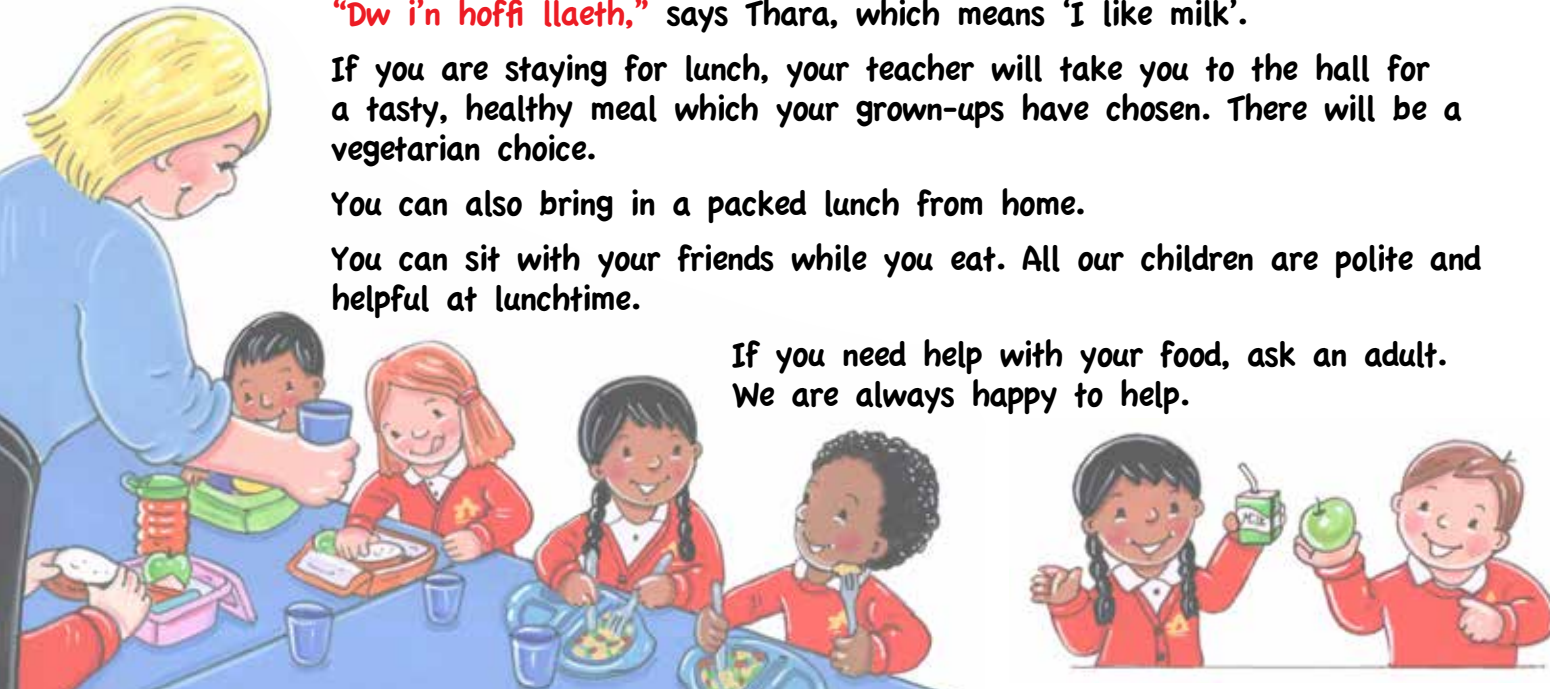
"Dw i'n hoffi llaeth," says Thara, which means 'I like milk'.

If you are staying for lunch, your teacher will take you to the hall for a tasty, healthy meal which your grown-ups have chosen. There will be a vegetarian choice.

You can also bring in a packed lunch from home.

You can sit with your friends while you eat. All our children are polite and helpful at lunchtime.

If you need help with your food, ask an adult.

What if I need the toilet?

You can go to the toilet whenever you need to. Our toilets are just the right size for children.

Dylan feels very grown-up going to the toilet on his own. If you want help, ask a teacher.

Dylan practised at home, while wearing his uniform, so he knew what to do.

If you have an accident, don't worry. Just let your teacher know and they will help you. Your grown-ups will have left some spare clothes at school.

After flushing, Dylan is very careful to wash his hands. **"I don't want to spread any germs,"** he says to himself.



At home time, your teacher will go to the door and look for your grown-up who will be waiting outside.



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“Hwyl fawr,” says their teacher, which means ‘Goodbye’.
