Starting school

Starting school can have its ups and downs and despite Alys being familiar with YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen by attending the nursery provision; when it came to starting Reception, it took a while for her to settle in. “It took almost two weeks for Alys to settle in to the reception class even though she’d been at the nursery. Once she settled, she’s never looked back, she loves school. She loves English, Music and History, she’s an all-rounder, she likes to do a bit of everything,” says Sheree.

Getting ready to move on

Alys and her parents are preparing the transition to comprehensive school and there have been many discussions as to which school Alys will attend. “Alys is excited and nervous about going to comprehensive school. There was some discussion about going to an English medium school but as she has always been educated through the medium of Welsh; it makes sense for her to continue her education in a Welsh speaking environment,” says Sheree.

Inspirational teachers

“The teachers have all had a huge influence on Alys. They have a brilliant rapport with the children. They have something a little bit extra and communicate with each child as an individual. They level with the children, they are friendly and approachable but also instil a strong sense of boundaries,” says Sheree.

Rewards for speaking Welsh

Encouraging the children to speak Welsh to each other is part of the culture at YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen. There is an emphasis on recognising children’s effort to using the language and as a result, there is a positive environment in which to develop their Welsh. “The school give weekly certificates to the children who have tried to speak Welsh and pupils collect daily tokens for speaking Welsh.

There is a pizza party at the end of each term for those children who have collected the most tokens ,” says Sheree.

Links with the local community

YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen actively seek opportunities for the children to build connections with the local community. “School is great at integrating with the community. They have had a therapy dog come to help those low in confidence; the children get to read to the dog in a safe and non-judgmental environment. They also have strong links with the local library and arrange regular visits. The school choir and band visit nursing and care homes in the area and perform for the residents. School used the local chapel recently to stage a wedding for the children to watch so that they could understand what happens at a Christian wedding,” says Sheree.

Learning outside

“It’s a traditional building with a huge amount of space and they have an outdoor classroom which is lovely and they do forest school from nursery right through to year 6. There is a climbing wall and an adventure playground on the yard for the children to support the children’s physical development which is great, ”

Building confidence and independence

Alys has additional health needs and YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen have supported her in managing them throughout her school journey. Alys has been preparing for the transition to comprehensive school, building confidence in her independence and adapting to her new school environment. The school has excellent transition arrangements which have made this process smooth and reassuring. She’s going to miss the school immensely and has already asked if she can still help with school events next year! It says so much about the school that so many want to return after leaving; they are all welcomed back with open arms and it was great to see so many ex-pupils visit the Summer Fair this year and even help on the stalls!” says Sheree.

A place for every child

“It has been such a positive experience for us. The school builds really good relationships and engages with families through effective communication and an open-door policy. They cater for children with all needs, whether its physical, behavioural or emotional. There’s a place for every child at the school,” says Sheree.

Settling in and our school curriculum



Our school hours

- The school day runs from 8.50am to 3.20pm.
- Nursery children will start at 8.50 am and finish at 11.20am.

Breakfast club

A breakfast club is held at the school for every pupil free of charge from 8.10am.

Uniform

It is expected that each child will wear the school uniform, which is a purple jumper / hoodie , a white t-shirt and grey / black trousers. The school staff will encourage the children to wear the official uniform to show that they are proud to be a member of the school. We also realise that the cost of having the school logo can be expensive and there is no expectation that pupils have to wear embroidered clothes.

School meals

We encourage pupils to eat our excellent, nutritious lunches, which are prepared, cooked and served on the premises by our catering staff. All children, including those who bring packed lunches, sit together in the hall. All children receive free school meals.

Our school curriculum: meaningful, interesting and relevant

Central to the school’s ethos is the belief that children respond with greater enthusiasm and commitment to the learning process when they are provided with experiences which are meaningful, interesting and relevant to the lives which they lead.

Curriculum for Wales

Our curriculum ensures that our pupils develop the skills and attributes of the four purposes... to become:

1. Ambitious, Capable Learners.
2. Enterprising, Creative Contributors.
3. Ethical, Informed Citizens.
4. Healthy and Confident Individuals.

We encourage the development and the importance of the four purposes by using our four characters – Dyfan Dyfalbarhau, Mari Mentrus, Elin Eco and Hari Hyderus.

**Dyfalbarhau** = perseverance

**Mentrus** = adventurous

**Eco** = Eco!

**Hyderus** = confident

The Welsh Language

Welsh is the official language of communication throughout the school, but all communication between the school and home is bilingual. The nursery and reception staff are all experts in language immersion and all pupils make excellent progress in their acquisition of the language throughout the early part of their schooling. English speaking parents and guardians are fully supported to enable them to learn the language and to use the language at home; the readiness of the home to adopt the language and learn along side the pupil has a considerable impact on the speed of language acquisition. The school shares resources upon starting in school to use at home and can sign post families to Welsh courses and support networks e.g. the Caffi Cymraeg (Welsh Café) in the local library. Pupils that join the school from an English medium school are given extra support to learn the language and pupils that join in year 3 or later will access an intensive immersion course in a neighbouring school during their first term

The first steps

Finding somewhere that would be the right fit for her girls was Sarah’s main priority when she began researching a school setting and YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen ticked all the boxes from day one. “When we started the adoption process we began looking at schools and in particular which schools would be best suited with supporting us in our situation.

We were assured to hear that the school had supported other children who had been through the care system and that all the teachers have been trained in the therapeutic parenting approach, that was what swung it for us and that school is within walking distance from home is a bonus. Our priority when looking for a school was that the girls would get the support that they needed and they’ve had that since the very start,” says Sarah.

Integrating school into everyday life

“The girls were initially delayed in coming to us and due to the delay they had been taken out of education. I had to present a case to a panel for the girls to be able to start school earlier than recommended. We had been advised that the girls delay starting school until the September as they had come to us in the Spring. By the time they had been with us for 11 weeks I knew they were more than ready for school, they needed the routine and we, as a family, needed to bring going to school into our lives, we all wanted that normality and stability and the girls wanted to make friends. School were fantastic in supporting me present the case and I’m proud to say that we won and the girls started school that Summer and haven’t ever looked back,” says Sarah.

Settling in

Sarah wasn’t sure what to expect when the girls started school and as various concerns began to come to light the team at YGG Gwaun Cae Gurwen worked with Sarah and now the girls are right on track. “I’ve had many positive experiences with school. From the very start they’ve been so supportive. The girls have come on in leaps and bounds. When P was in Year 1 it was flagged by her teacher that her understanding wasn’t where they’d like it to be and I had concerns that she might have Dyspraxia as she was constantly bumping into things. I sought help from the medical team through the adoption service and they advised that P didn’t have a medical condition, she was in trauma mode. I discussed this with school and we agreed that extra help over that first summer would be helpful and additional help continued once she returned to class in the September. We’re now at the point where we’re talking about P no longer needing the additional help in school as she’s come on so much,” says Sarah.

Discovering activities and having fun

“The girls enjoy school, they love the uniform being purple. They go to breakfast club which they love and is a massive help being a working parent. They do club after school on a Tuesday where they’ve discovered a love of cricket and P has been on a residential trip. The girls have just started at Brownies which is a huge confidence boost,” says Sarah.

Living by school values

Sarah is excited for what the future holds for her girls and she can’t wait to see what they love to learn. “We talk about school values, about kindness and respect and we talk about not giving up. I’m so proud of the girls. School feels like home from home and they’re building their life skills and conversing in Welsh and English which is incredible. They sing in Welsh all the time at home, it’s so much fun!,” says Sarah.

Children say:

Enriched curriculum: activities, trips, visitors and P.E.

Extra-curricular activities

A range of extra-curricular activities are provided in the school. We want to ensure that all pupils get the opportunity to develop their interests and we are proud to offer something for everyone.

We have a strong sporting tradition and often compete in rugby, football, netball, athletics and cricket competitions.

Our after school sport clubs cater for all abilities and are often run by the Urdd with which we have a long lasting partnership.

We also have a ‘Performance Club’ where pupils can learn to sing and develop their acting skills in a friendly and supportive environment.

In addition to this, we have ‘Clwb y Waun’ which has a range of activities on offer rangin from arts and crafts, coding to cooking.

The school choir club is held during school dinner times and compete in local Eisteddfods and perform often in community events.

Instrument Lessons

Neath Port Talbot music service offers high quality tuition and as a school; we are proud to say that we take full advantage of their expertise and offer brass, string and drum lessons.

All lessons are very popular and due to the number of pupils that play, we can boast a brass band that competes in local competitions and plays in community events.

Visits and visitors

School visits to places of interest enrich the children’s learning, and visitors to the school talk about their expertise and experiences. Recent trips have included:

Admissions policy

Nursery

Children can be admitted to the part-time Nursery a term after their third birthday (except when this is inconvenient due to school arrangements) or at the discretion of the school and will progress to full time education in the Reception Class at the beginning of the Autumn term following their fourth birthday. Children attending the nursery class will not have automatic right of admission to full time education at the same school, and parents will need to request a place in the Reception class through the L.E.A.

Parents should approach the Headteacher of their preferred nursery school for an Admissions Application Form or contact the L.E.A. Admissions Officer (Helen Lewis) directly. Reception

All admissions to reception class (full time education) are also approved by the Admissions Officer, Pupil Parent Support. Children are admitted to reception classes in the September following their fourth birthday.
