As a Headteacher, Martin Evans values the nurturing values and immersive Welsh culture that YGG Cwmllynfell provides for his family.

Elan is 11 years old and is in Year 6, Efa is 8 years old and is in Year 4 and Gwenan is now at Ysgol Gyfun Ystalyfera in Year 8.

Choosing a school for us

When it came to choosing a school for their first daughter, Martin and his wife knew they wanted to be close to home and to embrace their family's previous experiences of school life. "We chose the school because it's in our local village and we wanted to give our children a fully immersive Welsh education, it was our main priority. We are a close-knit community and YGG Cwmllynfell creates a sense of nurture which we highly value. My wife's family attended YGG Cwmllynfell so it was familiar to us and it's wonderful the children are sharing that bond," says Martin.

First experiences

Parents can have many apprehensions and expectations when their children start school. Martin and his wife received a wonderful first impression that has remained throughout their children's time at YGG Cwmllynfell. "We felt YGG Cwmllynfell to be very inclusive. We wanted Gwenan and all the girls, to feel confident and with it being a small school it made us feel comfortable that class sizes would be small and children would receive individual attention. I did feel when Gwenan started in Meithrin she thrived, she was playing in the mud kitchen and being imaginative in her play, her creativity and confidence grew and the journey through school has been easy," says Martin.

Learning the local area

Martin has been impressed how YGG Cwmllynfell have embraced the local area and made it an immersive part of the children's learning experience. "I think it's important that children know and recognise where they are, that they are familiar with their community and local area. The new Welsh curriculum focuses heavily on children knowing about their locality and Elan has been immersed in this learning at YGG Cwmllynfell. People have come into school to talk to the children about local history. Local history is a huge part of life at school. They regularly head out into the local village and they pause and discuss the history of

local buildings. They will examine local photographs and compare what they can see. By building on their knowledge of their locality the children build on their skills for life," says Martin.

Competing at Schools Eisteddfod

Spring Term is all about the Urdd Eisteddfod, a celebration of the Welsh Language and Culture. This annual event is held over a week with local primary schools performing songs, recitation and dance. "Recently YGG Cwmllynfell competed in the prestigious Urdd Eisteddfod event and the school competes every year. This year, YGG Cwmllynfell went through to the final round. My girls are quite musical and school offers additional tuition. The girls have had opportunities to perform at various events. It's an experience that my wife and I had as children and we wanted the same for the girls," says Martin.

Fulfilling their potential

"We're happy that the girls have been able to fulfil their potential throughout their years at YGG Cwmllynfell. There's after school and extra-curricular activities, but it is the strong sense of nurturing that really shines through. Gwenan enjoyed writing stories and music, Elan loves maths and all the girls love being at school and with their friends. Efa is creative, she likes reading, her reading skills are excellent. Staff know the children, parents and grandparents and everyone is invited into school to help support the school community. Everyone knows each other and cares, it's a strong element of school life. School is warm, welcoming, happy and thriving," says Martin.

Settling in and our school curriculum

Our school hours

The school day starts at 8.50am and ends at 3.20pm. Nursery children will start at 8.50am and finish at 11:20am. Pupils that attend Cylch Meithrin Cwmllynfell, on the school grounds, can be collected from school by the staff to attend Cylch from 11:20am until 3:20pm.

Breakfast Club

A breakfast club is held at the school for every pupil, free of charge, from 8.10am.

Food in school

All meals are prepared, cooked and served on the premises by our catering staff. All children, including those who bring packed lunches, sit together in the hall, but we do encourage pupils to eat our excellently prepared and nutritious meals. All pupils from Reception to Year 6 receive free school meals. The nursery children who attend Cylch Meithrin Cwmllynfell also join us for their lunch.

School Uniform

It is expected that each child will wear the school uniform, but it is not compulsory. The school staff will encourage the children to wear the official uniform to show that they are proud to be a member of the school.

Curriculum

At YGG Cwmllynfell, staff, pupils, governors, parents and carers have worked together to develop a broad, balanced and exciting curriculum: that is underpinned by our vision and ethos: "Dysgwyr Da, Dyfodol Disglair".

Our curriculum is focused on ensuring that pupils develop the four main purposes of being:

Family connections

Lauren is not from the local area but her husband is and choosing YGG Cwmllynfell is carrying on a family tradition which the children are embracing. "The children love going to school. Where we live it's a very small village so to us it was important that the children grow up knowing their local area and local community. My husband's family have grown up here and there is a strong sense of community and people know each other. We wanted the children to experience the same and have the same experience as their dad," says Lauren.

Bringing learning home

Part of the joy for parents of their children starting school is when children come home enthusiastic and excited about what they have been learning. "Ella is currently learning about 'Earth'. She's coming home telling us all about what she has been learning in class. She tells us about the different planets, she can name them. She's been drawing Earth pictures out of tissue paper and painting them, she's been enjoying that very much. My little boy has been making flowers out of cupcake moulds, he's only two years old and he's doing really well. He loves being able to bring things home to keep," says Lauren.

Building confidence

As families adapt to the new routine of school, children start to experience new adventures and Ella has started to venture out into the local area with her class. "Ella is a little young yet for the after-school activities but she has been on school trips. Eddie only started in February so the focus has been on settling into the routine. Ella is starting to venture out into the local area which she's looking forward to doing more of. The older classes in school go on educational trips regularly. Ella said only yesterday that she likes going to school. I'm not sure what the future will hold for them, it's hard to say but it's lovely getting to share the journey with them. Even with my little boy, already his confidence has grown so much.

He's happy to communicate with anyone and I know the experience is preparing him ready for moving through the older stages of school life," says Lauren.

Embracing Welsh culture

Many parents are looking for opportunities where their children can embrace Welsh culture but not speaking Welsh yourself could be nerve wracking, but not at YGG Cwmllynfell. "I don't speak Welsh personally but it's never been a barrier, the teachers are familiar with who speaks which language most comfortably. It never feels like an issue and everyone is always so welcoming and friendly. The children feel safe going there and they're very happy. To see the children growing in the Welsh language, especially as I don't speak Welsh myself is wonderful. It's lovely to see how they are already becoming bilingual and how they can easily switch between English and Welsh. It's changing how we speak at home and it's brilliant to have that positive influence coming home from school. I can see their personalities starting to develop," says Lauren.

A small school with a big heart

YGG Cwmllynfell is a small school in comparison to other schools in the area but with that comes a real sense of school community and being part of an extended family. "It's such a small, local school you can see even the bigger boys and girls look after the younger ones. There is a sense of nurture and caring for each other. We'll be in Tesco or out and about and Ella will start waving at people, they get to know everyone in school and their world grows outside of the boundaries of the playground," says Lauren.

Trips, visitors and events

We arrange public concerts and services, for example at Christmas and on St. David's Day, visits from Theatre Na N'Og and others. We visit places of interest, which enrich the children's learning, and welcome visitors to the school to talk about their expertise and experiences.

Residential Visits

From Year 3, pupils are offered the opportunity to attend residential visits in Margam Park, Llanion, Abernant and the Urdd Camps at Llangrannog, Glan-Llyn and Cardiff.

Sport and P.E.

Our school has a large field to the rear, and a hard surface at the front of the school. There is a wide range of sports activities undertaken during the year where children represent the school. These include swimming, rugby, football, cricket, netball, rounders and athletics. Any child taking part represents the school and this is recognised as a privilege equal to academic and artistic achievement. It also fosters team spirit and the developmental skills.
