What happens when I get to school?

We also have a look at our visual timetable to see the plans for the day. Then we can share any exciting news that we have with the class.



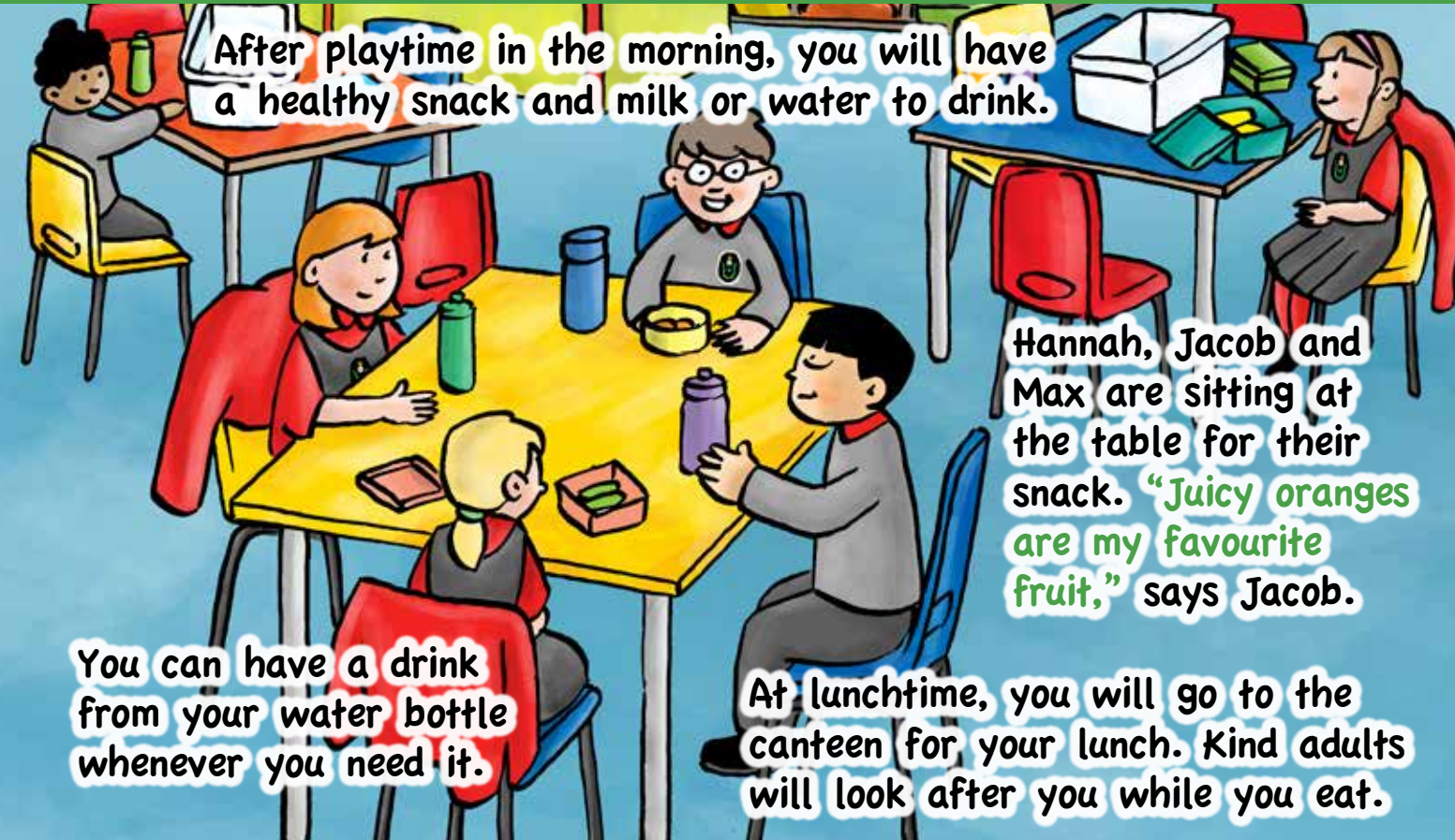
You can choose to play with lots of different things, such as cars, dolls, dinosaurs, paint, crafts, sand, water, playdough and LOTS more!

Only one girl or boy is allowed into the toilet at a time so you may need to wait until another child has finished. Don't worry if you need help or have an accident, just tell an adult.

Max has asked to go to the toilet. He has remembered to flush the toilet and wash his hands after he has finished.

"I am glad I practised going to the toilet by myself before I started school," he says.



What will I do outdoors?

There are lots of exciting things to do outdoors as well, such as playing on the trikes and scooters, painting or drawing with chalk on the big boards, digging in the sandpit or visiting our fabulous play park for some fun on the climbing frames and balancing beams.
