



What happens when I get to school?



In the corridor you will hang up your coat on the peg with your name on it.


Charlie, Lucy and Ben are already making friends as they hang their coats up.




What will I do in school?

The children are learning their sounds and how to read and write them.








Lucy, Ben and Charlie are threading beads.

There will always be grown-ups in the canteen and classroom to help you.




What happens if I need the toilet?
