


What happens when I come to nursery or school?

There are lots of fun ways to learn in nursery or school. Sometimes you work together with an adult, and sometimes you will work and play by yourself.


You can decide if you want to play and learn indoors or outdoors.

Now Katie is indoors. playing Lego on the carpet. "What should we build?" Katie asks.




What if I am hungry or thirsty?
