What happens when I come to nursery or school?

What will I do in nursery or school?

There are lots of fun ways to learn in nursery or school. Sometimes you work together with an adult, and sometimes you will work and play by yourself.

You can decide if you want to play and learn indoors or outdoors.

"Have a look at this mud cake!" she says. Your grown-ups will make sure that there are some spare clothes for you in school in case you get messy playing outside.

There are lots of areas where you can do different things. You can play in the creative area, read or write, build in the construction area, paint and make models. There is a mud kitchen outside where you can make mud pies.



Now Katie is indoors, playing Lego on the carpet. **"What should we build?"** Katie asks.



In reception, James is looking at a book with Sophie. **"I love this story,"** he says.

"I love the garden," says Nisha. **"We have planted lots of flowers."**

Nisha and Tom are in the reception garden.

What if I am hungry or thirsty?

In the morning, you will have a fruit snack or a bagel and have a drink of milk or water.

At lunchtime, nursery children who have lunch at school and all the reception children will be taken into the hall by the teacher. Your grown-ups will have chosen your lunch for you from a menu at home. You will collect your meal from the kind lunchtime staff and eat your lunch with your friends. You will listen to lovely, relaxing and gentle music while you eat.

"I can use a knife and fork," says Nisha.

"I practised at home before I started school."



What if I need the toilet?

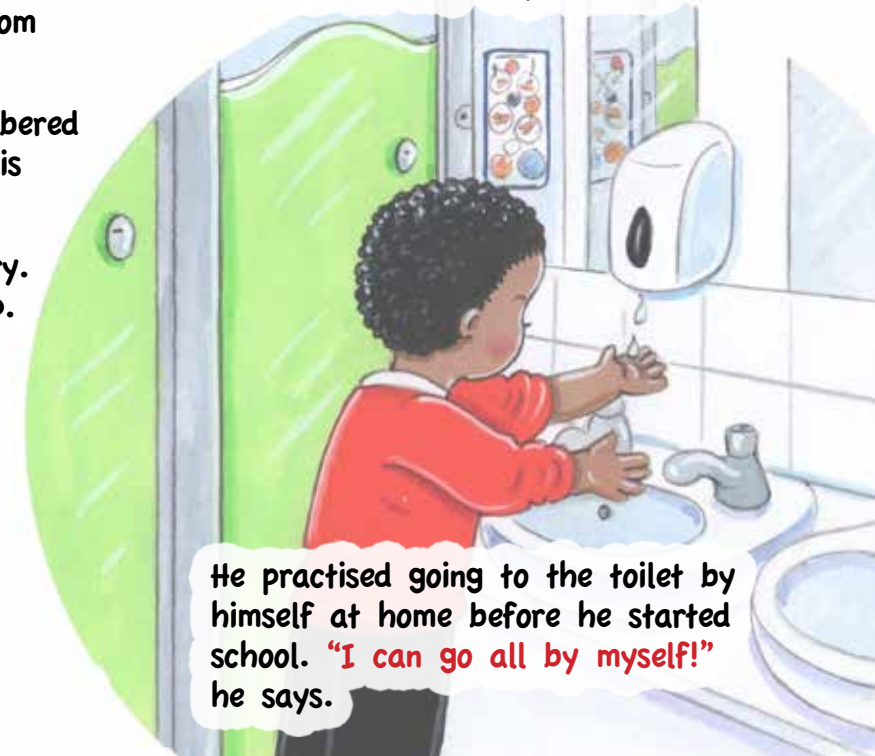
When you need to go to the toilet, put your hand up and ask your teacher. They will also remind you to go during the day from time to time.

James has been to the toilet and remembered to flush the toilet. Now he is washing his hands with soap and water.

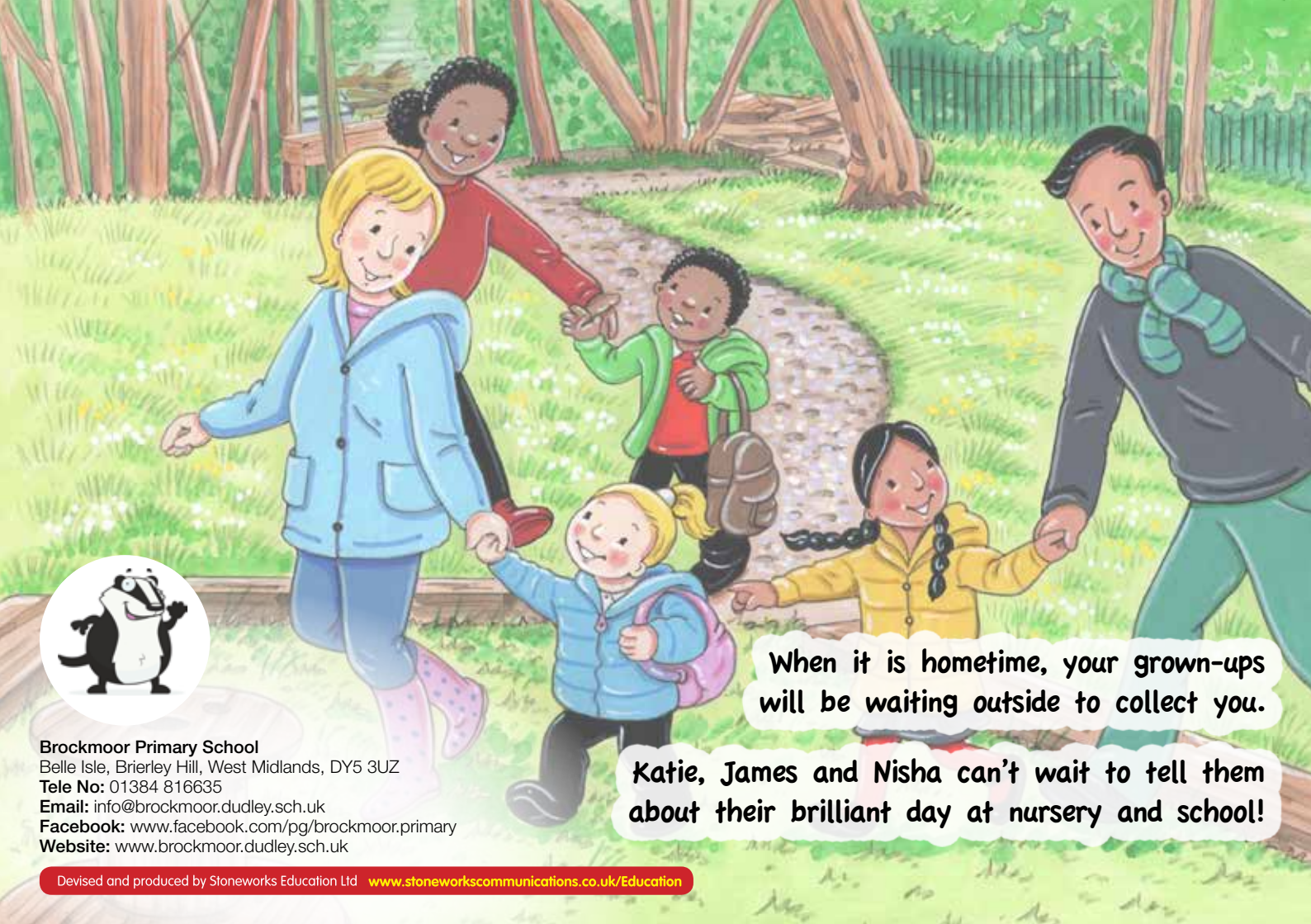
If you have a toilet accident, don't worry. Just tell your teacher and they will help.
