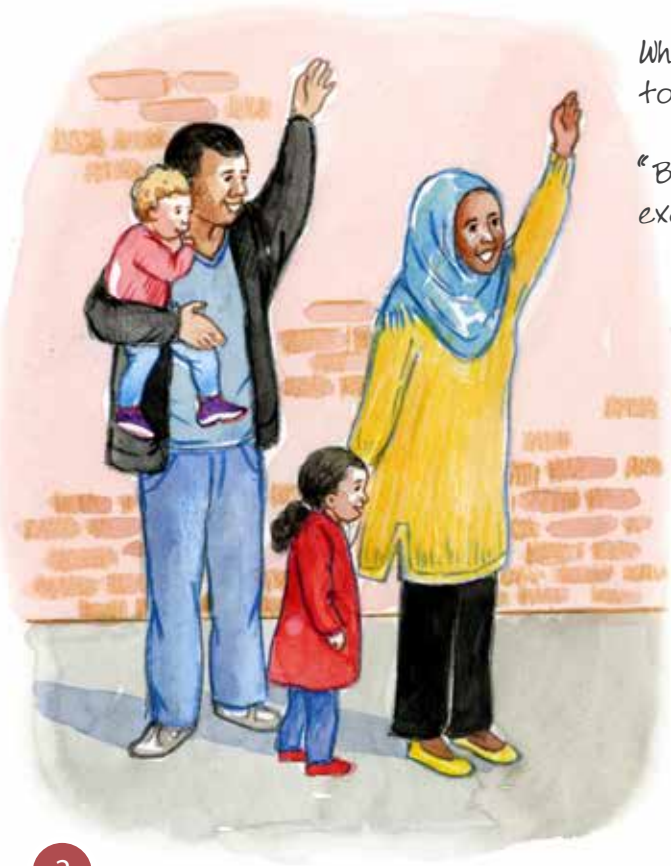


Amir, and Leila and Sam are going

What is your favourite meal?

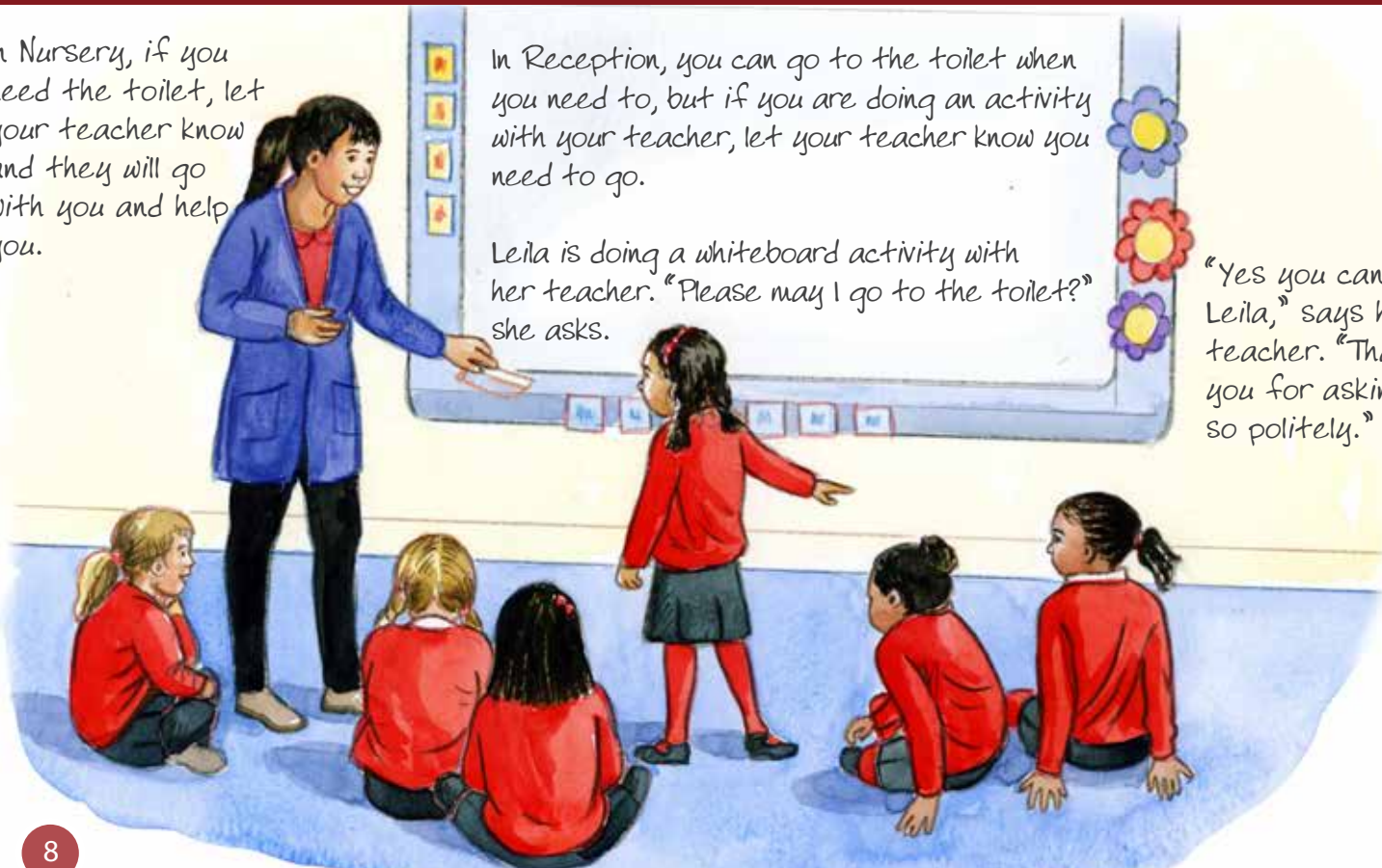
What if I need the toilet?
