


# What happens when I get to nursery or school?

"May I to go to the toilet?" she asks.






Leona goes to the toilet by herself, like you will when you come to nursery or school. Your grown-ups will make sure that you have lots of practice at home before you start.


If you need help or have an accident, let your teacher know. Your grown-ups will make sure there are some spare clothes in case you need to get changed.

"I am so glad I practised going to the toilet by myself," he says. "I feel very grown-up!"




# What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?



At lunchtime, reception children and any nursery children who have lunch at school will be taken to the hall by kind lunchtime staff. They will look after you while you eat.

Ishan is collecting his meal from the serving area and then he will sit with his friends to eat.

#### What happens at the end of the nursery session or school day?

"We are going to read with you every day," says her mum.
