How will I make friends?


We are friendly and kind at Rivacre. If you don't know anyone when you come here, you will soon make friends. There will be other children just like you who will want to make friends with you.

"Yes, that's fine. Thank you for asking so politely," says his teacher.

She has remembered to flush when she has finished.

She is washing her hands with soap and warm water and then dries them. If she has an accident, she knows she can ask her teacher for help.



What happens at the end of the day?
