Reception and Year 1 classes have their own outside learning areas. The grounds provide excellent opportunities for outdoor learning as well as ample space for sports and play.

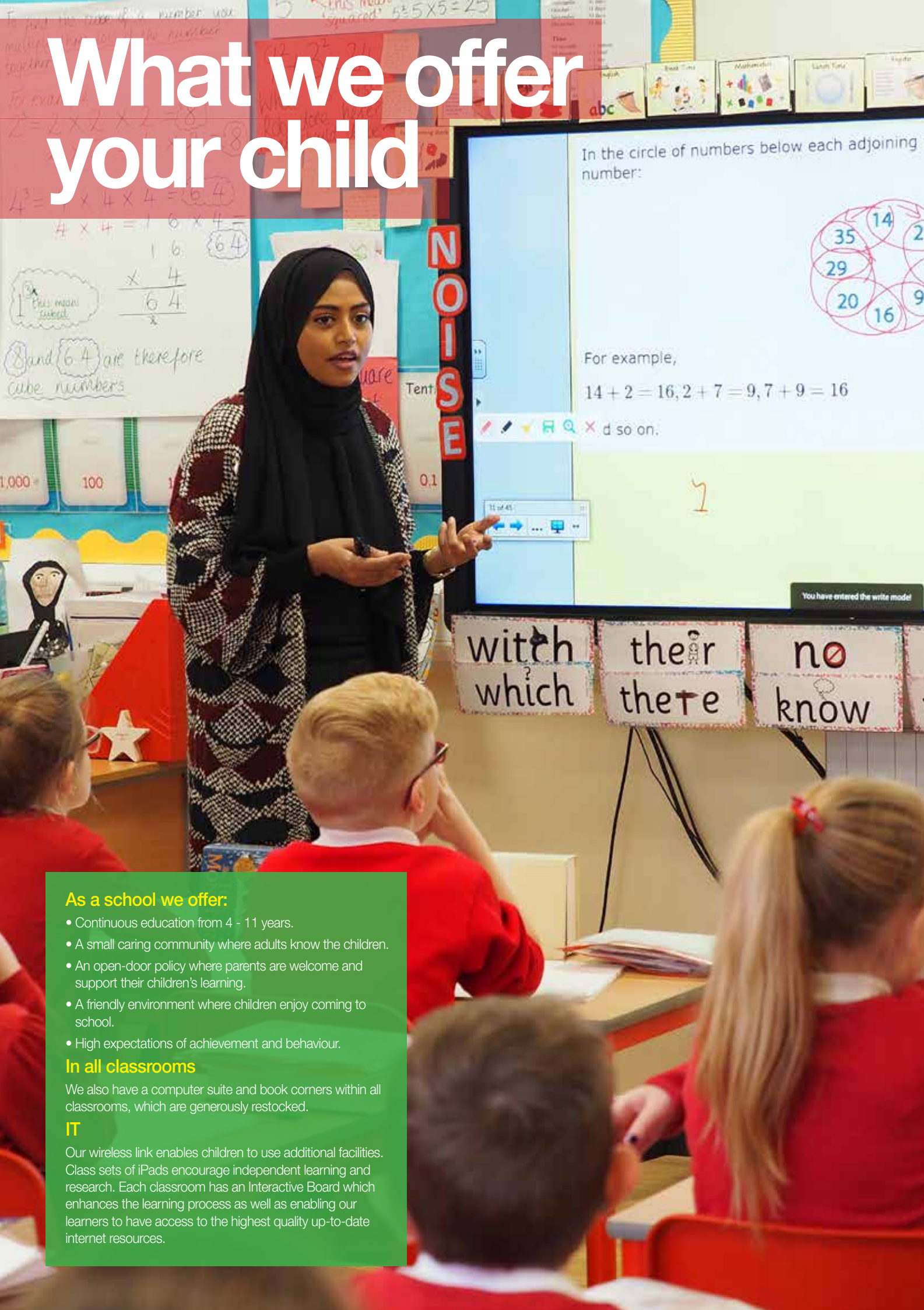
"Family Feel"

A light snack will be provided at 4:00pm. A variety of sandwiches or rolls, pitta, wraps, jacket potato with toppings, toasted tea cakes, crumpets or bagels, cake, yogurts and fruit are available.
