Rich and varied curriculum

We offer a rich and varied curriculum and we aim to inspire in our children a love of all subjects including sport, music, visual art and dramatic art. Parents can keep up to date with their child's learning by looking at the curriculum plans that are on our website.

Exciting opportunities

We aim to be as creative as possible in our approach and we follow a topic approach to learning. These topics are designed to be exciting, relevant and full of opportunities to inspire the children to find out more.

The curriculum is divided into three stages

1. Early Years Foundation Stage: from ages 0-5
2. Key Stage 1: from ages 5-7
3. Key Stage 2: from ages 7-11

Music

Music and singing are an important part of our school life. The children have regular singing sessions. All children in Year 4 receive musical tuition in an instrument, such as flute, violin and glockenspiel. We also have individual music lessons each week for the flute, singing, guitar, piano and recorder.

Performances

We take every opportunity for our children to become involved in performing music. Examples including our Tudor Choir performing at Sudbury Music Festival and singing at local churches, the Children's Hospice and other community settings.

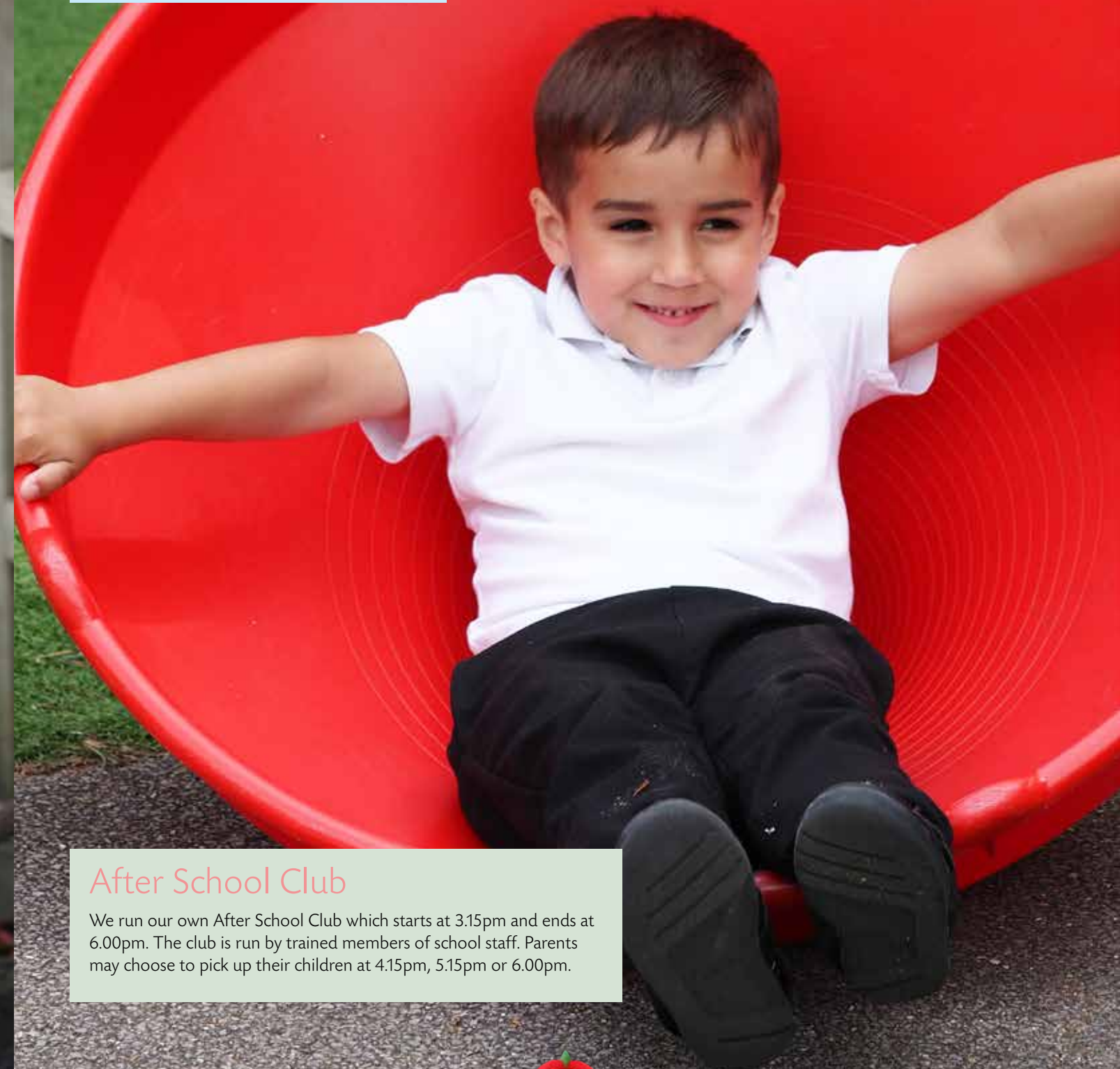

Breakfast Club

We offer a daily Breakfast Club in school which starts at 7.30am. Parents are able to drop off children anytime between 7.30am and 8.40am and the children enjoy breakfast with their friends and time to play for a short while before going to their classes at 8.40am.



After School Club

We run our own After School Club which starts at 3.15pm and ends at 6.00pm. The club is run by trained members of school staff. Parents may choose to pick up their children at 4.15pm, 5.15pm or 6.00pm.

Clubs

We have an extensive range of lunchtime and after school clubs. Examples include:

- Sewing and embroidery.
- Gardening
- Choir.
- Reading club.
- Homework club.
- Sports activities such as football, rugby, cricket, tennis, dodgeball, dance, gymnastics, boxercise or fencing.

Sport

Sport has a high profile here and we have a qualified Sports Teacher and also a Sports Coach. We are proud of the different sports we offer to our children including fencing, dance, athletics, cricket, football, rugby etc. Our children go weekly to the local gymnastics club for excellent gymnastics teaching as well as to the local swimming pool for weekly swimming lessons. Our after-school clubs also allow children to enjoy sport until 4.15pm.
