


# What happens when I get to school?

Your grown-ups will bring you into the cloakroom.



You will hang up your coat on your own coat hook, like Grace is doing.

You then take off your outside shoes and put on your indoor shoes.



Then you will find your name card and put it in the basket to show that you are in school.

We will give you your own water bottle. You will fill it up at the sink, so you can have some water when you are thirsty.







You will choose an activity to do by yourself or with friends. When you have been coming to school for a few weeks and you have settled in, at 9.00am we will gather together on the carpet to welcome each other into school and have a chat before we start our activities for the day.

#### What will I do in school?



There are lots of fun things for you to do in school. Sometimes you will do activities with your teacher, but a lot of the time, you can choose for yourself.

Yasmin and Edward are looking at the iPads together. They are doing a matching game. They are having fun helping each other find all the matching pairs.

Joe and Lucy are painting pictures. "I am painting a big sun," says Lucy. "That's good," says Joe. "I am painting a big blue sky."





Grace is playing with Daniel. They are having fun building with sand.

"This is like being at the seaside," says Grace.


"I love building sandcastles," says Daniel.

If you are hungry in the morning, you can have a snack at the snack table. Just remember to wash your hands before you sit down to eat.






Yasmin and Grace are having their snack together. They have been getting to know each other this morning and they are becoming friends.

# What happens at playtime?

around or if you prefer to do more quiet things. You will be able to play with the other children in school and we all play happily together.

If you can't find anyone to play with or can't see something that you would like to do, just go to the 'Buddy Stop' and one of the kind grown-ups who look after you at playtime will come straightaway and help you.

# What happens if I need the toilet?



If you need the toilet, just put your hand up to let your teacher know. We are very proud of our bright and colourful toilets as the children helped design them.

Remember to wash and dry your hands when you have finished. If you need help or have an accident, don't worry. Just let a teacher know and they will help.

## What happens at the end of the school day?

When school is ending for the day, you all sit on the carpet. Your teacher will read you a story or have a chat with you about what you have been doing during the day.

Your teacher will hand out your book bags, and you will collect your coat and belongings.

"My dad is coming to collect me," says Joe.
"That's great, Joe. We are going outside to meet all your grown-ups now," says the teacher.

You will line up and your teacher will take you outside where your grown-ups will be waiting to collect you.

When you see your grown-up, let your teacher know. When your teacher says you can go, you can go home with your grown-up.

Grace is looking at a book at home with her mum. "We learnt about butterflies today at school," says Grace.

"I really loved going to school today. I had so much fun and I made a new friend called Yasmin. I can't wait to go back tomorrow," she says.

We will send books home with you, for you to look at with your grown-ups.
