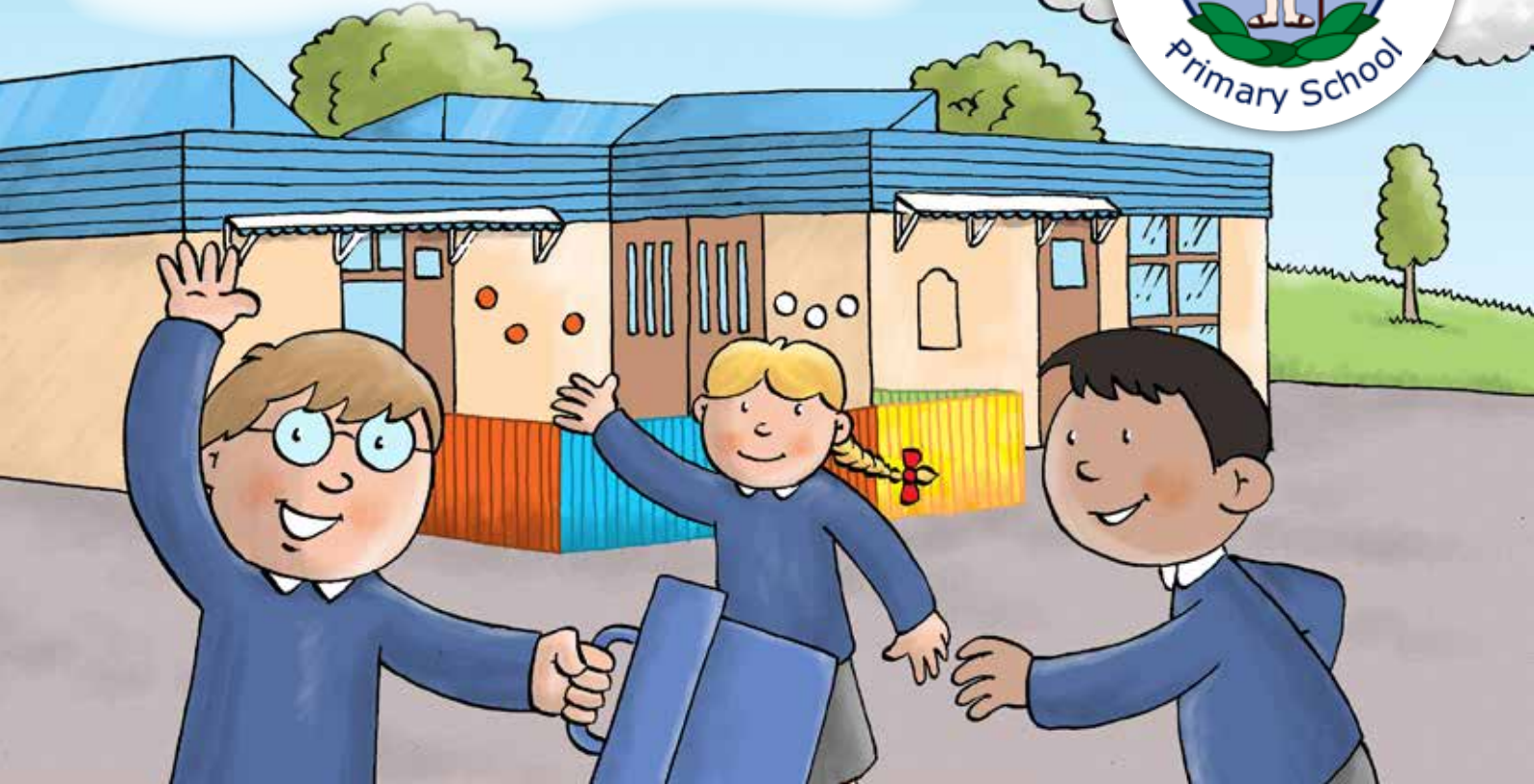
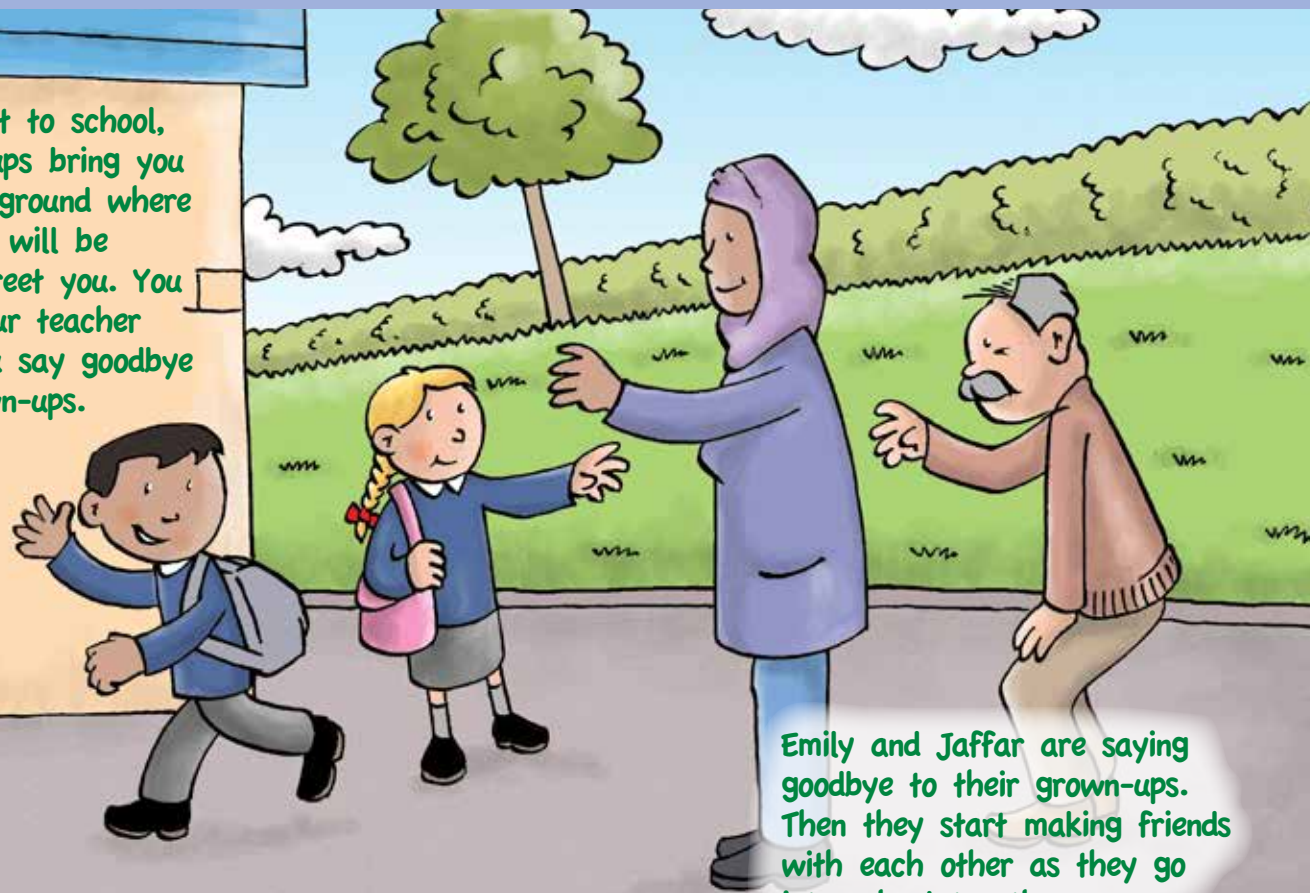


Jonathan, Emily and Jaffar

You will then go into your classroom and find your name and photo for self-registration. You will take this and put it on the special registration picture. This lets everyone know that you are in school today.

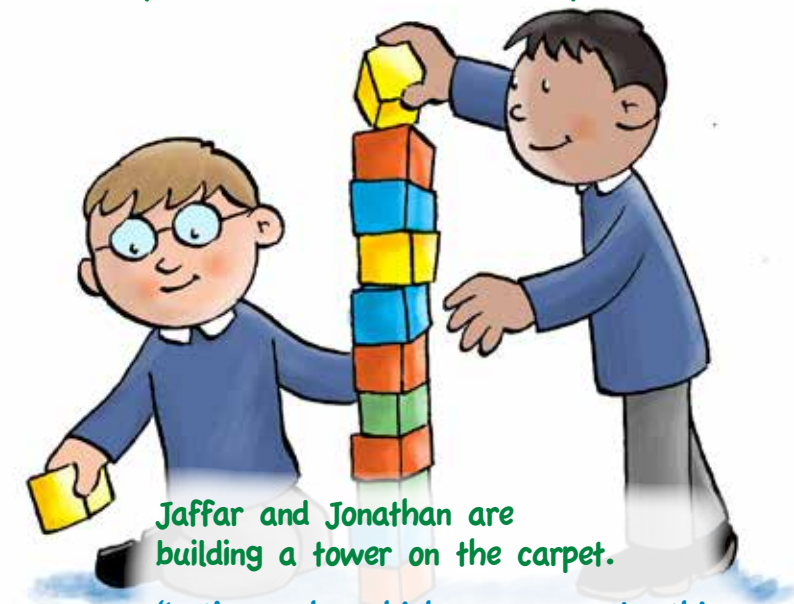

# What will I do in school?

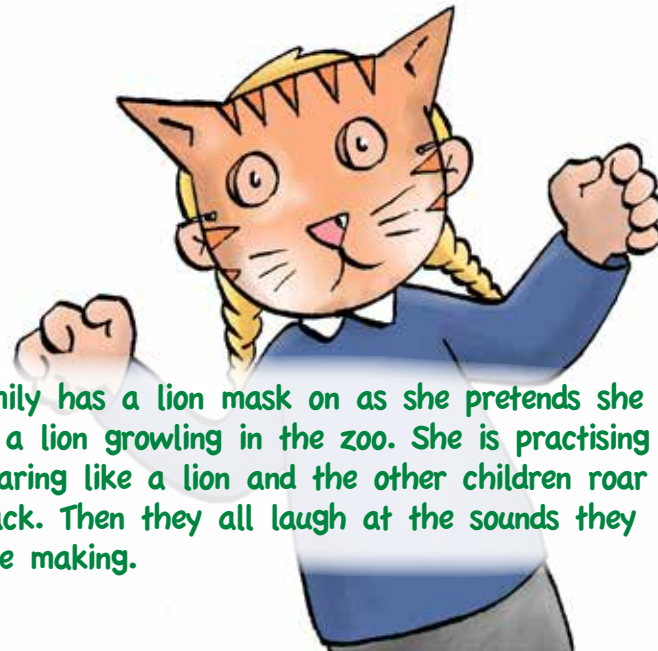
Your teacher will be working with you and helping you learn phonics. Then you will be able to choose what you would like to do from the many fun activities we have for you:

Jonathan is in the lunch queue and a nice grown-up is helping him get the food he wants.

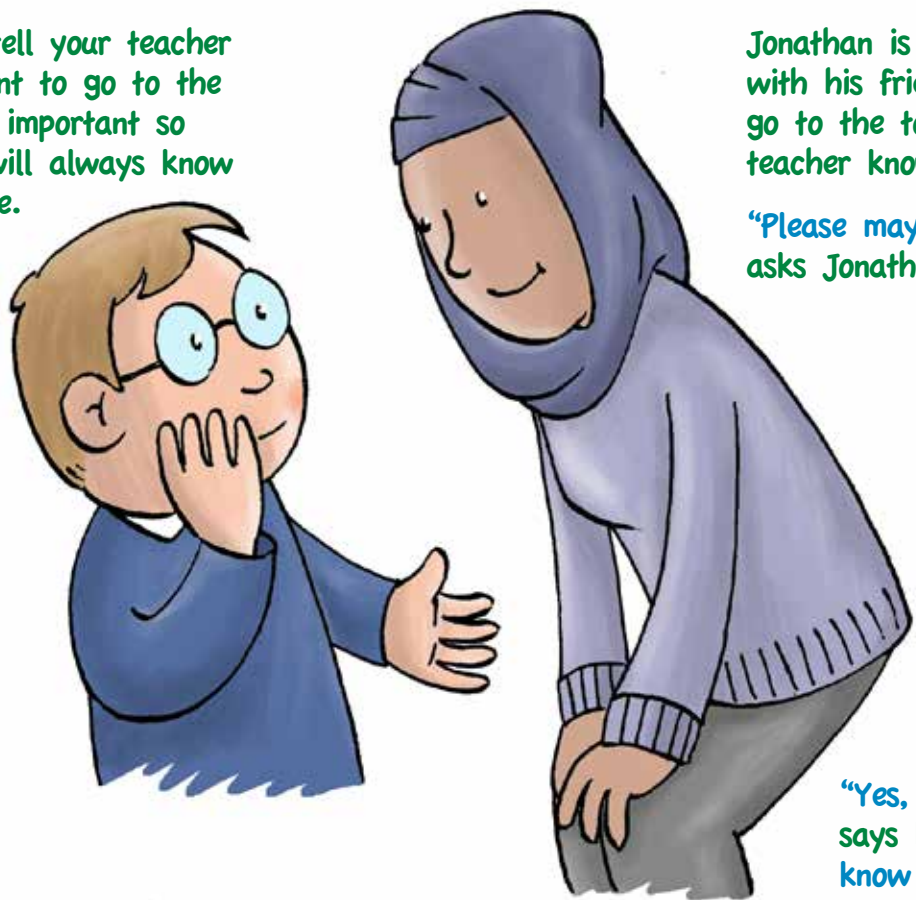
"Thank you," says Jonathan. "I love vegetables. My mum says they are really good for us."

"Has anyone been to a park like this?" the teacher asks.

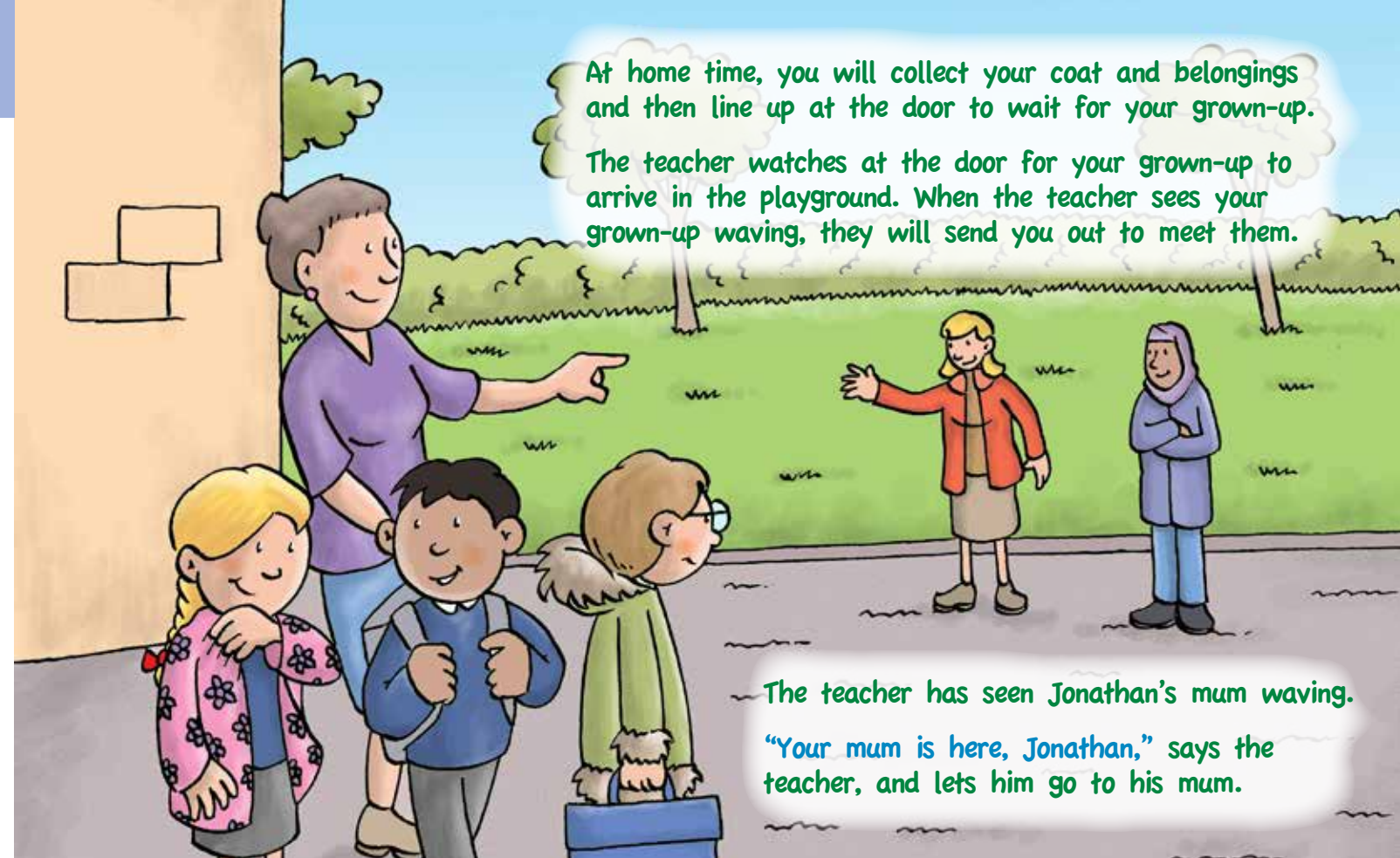
"I go to the park in town," says Jaffar. "My parents take us there on Sundays to have a picnic when the sun shines."
