What will I do in school?





What happens when I need to go to the toilet?

If you need to go to the toilet, you can just go but if you are doing an activity with your teacher, it is polite to tell them where you are going.

The toilets are in the shared area between the two classrooms. You will go to the toilet by yourself so your grown-ups will make sure you have lots of practice before you start school. If you need some help, just let your teacher know.

Omar remembers to flush and then washes his hands with warm soapy water and dries them really well. This helps to stop any germs spreading.



What if I am hungry or thirsty?

When you arrive at school, you will have breakfast. At lunchtime you will wash your hands and the lunchtime staff will take you to the dinner hall. They will stay with you to look after you while you eat.

If you are having a cooked school meal, you will go to the serving area to collect your meal and then sit down to eat with your friends. The meals are healthy and delicious. You can choose a halal meat or vegetarian option every day. You will sit with the children in your class.

"I can't wait to try mine," says Ameera. We all use good table manners, which means we use knives and forks, and we are polite and kind.

It is a good idea to have lots of practice using cutlery by yourself before you start school.
