




What do I need for my first day at senior school?

Uniform

We are very proud to be Reptonians and of our wonderful reputation. We expect our students to enhance the reputation of the school by wearing the correct uniform and by looking smart.



You will also need a PE and swimming kit but you will not need them for your first day.

You will use a Repton School bag (backpack or pull along), which is big enough to fit your books and stationery and small enough to fit in your locker.

It is a good idea to pack your bag each night, ready for the next day. This means you have time to check you have not missed anything rather than rushing things in the morning.

Make sure that your uniform and any equipment or any personal items you bring into school are clearly labelled with your name. You are not allowed to use mobiles or any other electronic devices in school. If you are found using any device, it will be handed into reception and your parents/ carers will be contacted.

What happens in a school day at Repton Senior School?

The school doors open from 7:15am, and students are expected to be in their tutor room by 7:45am. The school day ends at 3:00pm Monday to Thursday, and 12:00pm on Friday.

You will have lessons covering different areas of the curriculum, taught by specialist teachers.

Break and lunchtime

There will be a break and lunchtime. You can bring a healthy lunch from home or choose something from our fantastic range of school meals.

End of day

At the end of the school day, you can travel home unaccompanied. All students in senior school will have the privilege to leave the school building. If your parents/carers do not wish for you to walk home, they must opt out by emailing your

Head of Year.

You will soon get used to moving between classrooms. We will help you find your way round at the start of the year and give you a map. If you ever need help, just ask a teacher or older student. They will be happy to assist.



What will I study?

You will study a British independent school curriculum which combines the best elements of the English National Curriculum and content developed by our outstanding Repton teachers.


You will study: English, Maths, Science, Art, MOE Arabic, Computer Science, Design & Technology, French, Geography, History, MSC (Moral Social Cultural Studies), Music, Physical Education and Spanish. Muslim students will also take Islamic Studies.

Personal Study

You will have Personal Study work to complete outside of your lessons. To help you settle into this new discipline, we will gradually increase the amount of assignments as the year progresses.

Our state-of-the-art facilities include the following:

Who do I go to if I need help?

Pastoral care

Everyone has worries and problems from time to time. If you need help, you can speak to any teacher or member of staff that you feel comfortable talking to, but the best person will be your Tutor or Head of Year. You will see them every day and they will take an interest in all areas of your life at Repton Senior School. We also have a counsellor based full time at Fry Campus, who will always be available. We wanted our Y6 pupils to have a guaranteed time slot available to discuss their concerns and so we arranged for our counsellor to be available to you, for a drop-in session, every Tuesday morning at 7.45am. Just go and get registered and then ask your tutor if you can see the counsellor. Your parents/carers can also access our counsellor if they have any concerns about your wellbeing.

House points

You can continue to earn points for your house for excellent work going above and beyond expectations, representing your school and being a brilliant Reptonian role model!

Incentives and rewards

We have high standards for all Reptonians and believe that there should be an emphasis on rewarding excellence at every opportunity. Although there are sanctions if these standards are not met, we believe that emphasis on rewarding excellence is more productive.
