We have six school values:


Kindness, Resilience, Respect, Curiosity, Collaboration and Endeavour

What do I wear for my first day?




You will need a large rucksack and the following equipment on your first day:

- Black pen
- Pencil
- Scientific calculator

You will also need a school PE kit – but you don't need to bring this on your first day.

What happens on my first day?

On your first day, you will be greeted outside by the Year 7 team to direct and welcome you into school. From there you will be given a RFSS Student Planner and your timetable of lessons. You will then spend time with your Form Tutor and Tutor Group before starting some lessons.



What does the school day look like?

The school doors open at 08:30 and you are expected to be in your tutor room by 08:45 for registration. You then have five lessons every day, as shown in the timetable below.

At lunch, you can bring a packed lunch or you can enjoy something from our school canteen. You don't need to worry about bringing money to school as we operate a cashless system.

On Friday mornings, you will have your Year 7 assembly in the school hall.



What subjects will I study?

Hockey club, Mandarin club, Science club. Football club. Ukulele club and Debate club.


We review the timetable each term, so there's always something new and exciting for you to try!
