Our uniform consists of:


- · Green blazer and badge

What happens on my first day?

On your first day, you will arrive at school by 8.40am and go to the concrete basketball court between the astro-turf and PE block. There will be lots of signs around to help you find your way and lots of staff to ask if you need directions.

The bell will ring at 8.50am and you will be sent to the Games Hall where Ms Lawson and Mr McConville will be waiting.

They will welcome you and then your Tutor will take you to your tutor room for the rest of the first period.

Your Tutor will give you your timetable and any other information you need to help you settle in.

When it is time for your first lesson, school staff will collect you and take you to your next classroom. They will do this for every lesson during the first week.



Who was our Patron Saint, St. John Ogilvie?

St. John Ogilvie was born in 1579 and ordained a priest in 1610. At the time it was illegal to practise the Catholic faith

He preached and celebrated mass secretly in private homes, although this was punishable by death. He was betrayed and arrested. He refused to renounce his faith and was convicted of treason. He was hung at Glasgow Cross in 1615, aged thirty-six.

Over the centuries, Catholics were inspired by his faithfulness and began dedicating prayers to him.



In 1967, John Fagan from St. John Ogilvie Parish in Glasgow was very ill with cancer and close to death. His family and friends prayed to St John Ogilvie to ask him to intercede with God and John Fagan was cured.

In 1979, Pope Paul VI declared this a miracle and canonised St. John Ogilvie.

St. John Ogilvie is an inspiration to all of us. He remained faithful to his beliefs even at the cost of his life.

Our motto 'Fidelis Ad Finem' – meaning 'Faithful to the End' — is inspired by the faith, commitment and dedication of St. John Ogilvie.
