

How will Marsden Heights help me to get ready to come to secondary school?

We are all looking forward to welcoming you to MHCC. We understand that starting secondary school is a big step, and that you may be feeling both excited and nervous right now. We will do everything we can to make your move to us as easy as possible. We have created this booklet to help you to know what to expect when you start with us.

Your parents/carers may have already attended a special meeting to learn about the school. You will also attend two dedicated days, to help you prepare for starting Year 7. During these days, you will meet your new teachers, explore the college building and learn more about the school and what to expect in September.

Some pupils may also get the opportunity to attend a summer school.

How should I prepare for my first day?

We are very proud of our uniform at MHCC and we have high expectations of presentation.

As well as the uniform detailed below, as there can be a lot of cold and wet weather, a plain, dark-coloured coat is also required.



As part of our Covid safety requirement, you will need to wear your PE kit to school with your blazer on days where you have PE. You will need the following:


- MHCC PE shirt

You will need a sensible bag to fit A4 books and folders and you will need the following equipment:

- 2 green pens
- 2 black pens (no blue pens)
- 2 pencils
- · 30cm clear plastic ruler
- Large clear plastic penci
- Eraser
- Highlighter
- Protractor
- Sharpener
- Casio FX-85GTX scientific calculator

We will provide your parents/carers with a full uniform, and PE and equipment list. You can also get more information on our uniform guidelines, and where to order it, on our website.

Make sure that everything has your name on it, including your uniform, so things can be returned to you easily if they are mislaid



What happens in my first week at MHCC?

Before you start with us, plan ahead and make sure you know how long your walk or journey to school will take.

When you arrive on your first day, you will be greeted at reception by teachers and pupil leaders who will tell you where you need to go and what you need to do.

You don't need to worry, there will be plenty of people around to help you.

You will then spend some time with your progress group and progress tutor, and you will receive your planner and timetable.

The first few days are called 'The MHCC Way'. This is a special timetabled week, created to help you settle into the college and feel more at home.



You will learn where things are, meet lots of different teachers, including the Headteacher, and get to know your new classmates. It's a great way to begin your exciting journey with us.

Everyone at the school knows what the first day feels like, so we all do as much as possible to help you feel welcome and settle in.

You will find everyone at MHCC friendly and welcoming.





What does the college day look like?

Every day there are six periods for your lessons. There is also a break and lunchtime, plus every pupil can get a free breakfast at our Breakfast Club.

There are different classrooms for lessons but most of your lessons will be in the Year 7 Zone of the building. You will soon get used to finding your way around.

8.30 - Pupils escorted to check-in time 8.50 - 10.30 - Period 1 & 2


Break
