

# What do I need on my first day?

You are required to come to school in the correct uniform from your first day.

#### Behaviour



- Newton, after physicist and mathematician Sir Isaac Newton.
- Nightingale, after Florence Nightingale, the founder of nursing.
- Tolkien, after novelist J.R.R. Tolkien.
- Wilberforce, after William Wilberforce, who led the movement to abolish the slave trade.
- Garrett Anderson, after Elizabeth Garrett Anderson, the first woman in Britain to achieve a medical qualification.
- Pankhurst, after Emmeline Pankhurst, who founded the Suffragette movement to gain Votes for Women.


#### Homework Club
