

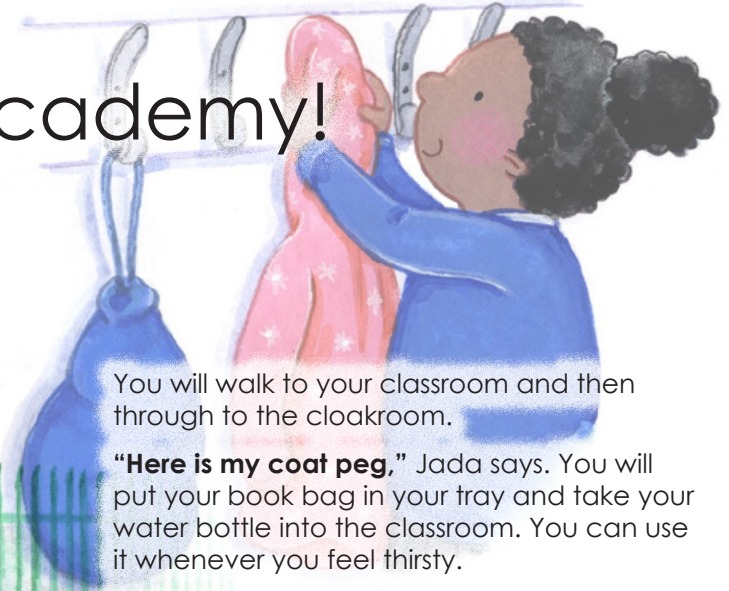
We are coming to Boothroyd Primary Academy!
