The teachers have done a lot to build his confidence. He is thriving in Year 1 and will happily take part in group discussions. We can see when he does sport out of school that he has become more confident," his Mum says.

UNDERSTANDING TEACHERS

"The staff understood Jack and what his needs were. They have encouraged him in a positive way and helped him achieve his full potential. They have taken an interest in our whole family and have known Eddy since he was a young baby and would ask Jack about him. The school has always felt very inclusive."

SMOOTH TRANSITION

"When Eddy started in the nursery at Button Lane it was all new to him after his previous nursery and he was with a larger group of children, but he settled in after just a couple of weeks. The transition was helped by his teachers coming to the house to meet him before he started," Carla says.

"Eddy has made good progress even though he is one of the younger ones in the year and having a uniform to wear has helped him feel part of the school. The teachers have all been very kind and encouraging. They have a lovely outside space and Eddy enjoys playing football and learning outdoors.
