

## What happens when I get to school?



You will come into school with your grown-up and line up in the playground before walking up the ramp into the cloakroom.

You will hang your coat on a peg with your name and your photo on it, like Sara has done. Then you will put your book bag and water bottle in a tray. Let your teacher know whenever you are thirsty and need a drink from your water bottle.

## What if I am hungry or thirsty?

In the morning, you will have a fruit snack and a drink of milk on the carpet in your classroom.

You will collect your lunch and then sit with your friends.

Practise using a knife and fork before you come to school, but there will be lots of adults to ask if you need help.

## What if I need the toilet?

You can go to the toilet by yourself when you need to, but remember to ask if you are doing work with your teacher. If you need help, tell your teacher.

The doors to the toilets are in the cloakroom, and everything will be just the right size for you.

Harry has used the toilet and flushed and now he is washing his hands with warm water and soap. He will dry his hands before he goes back to the classroom.

"I am glad I practised going to the toilet before I started school so I can go all by myself," he says.





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
