to St White's Primary School

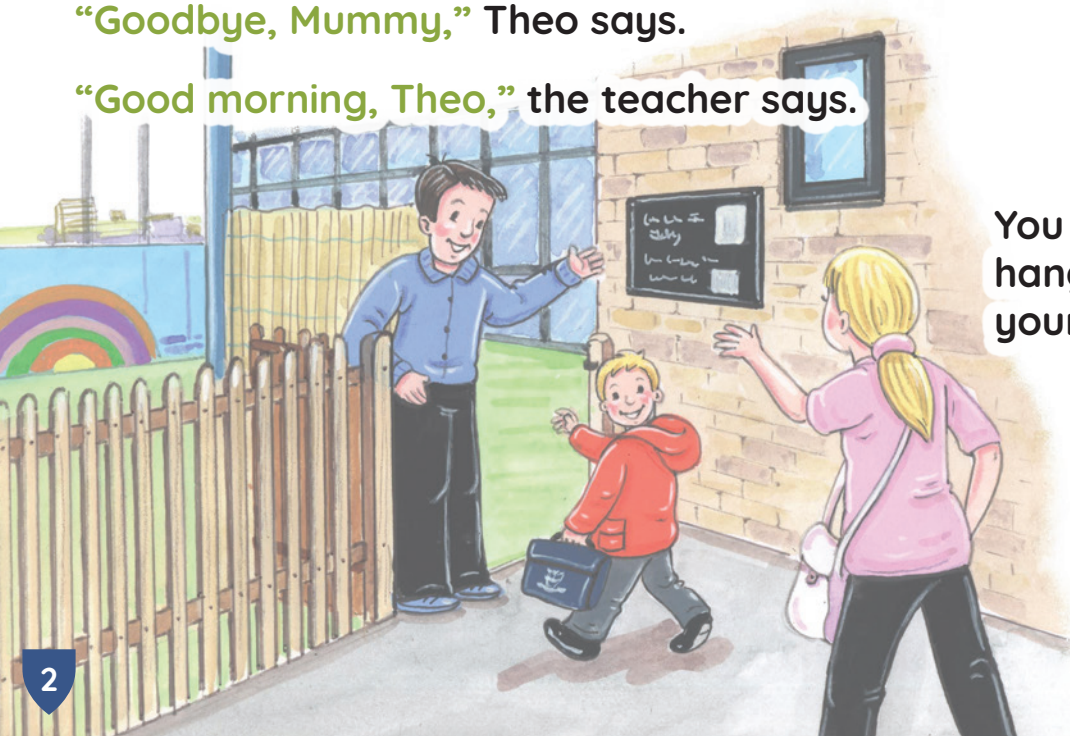


What happens when I get to school?

You will go into school and hang up your coat and put your bag in the bag box.

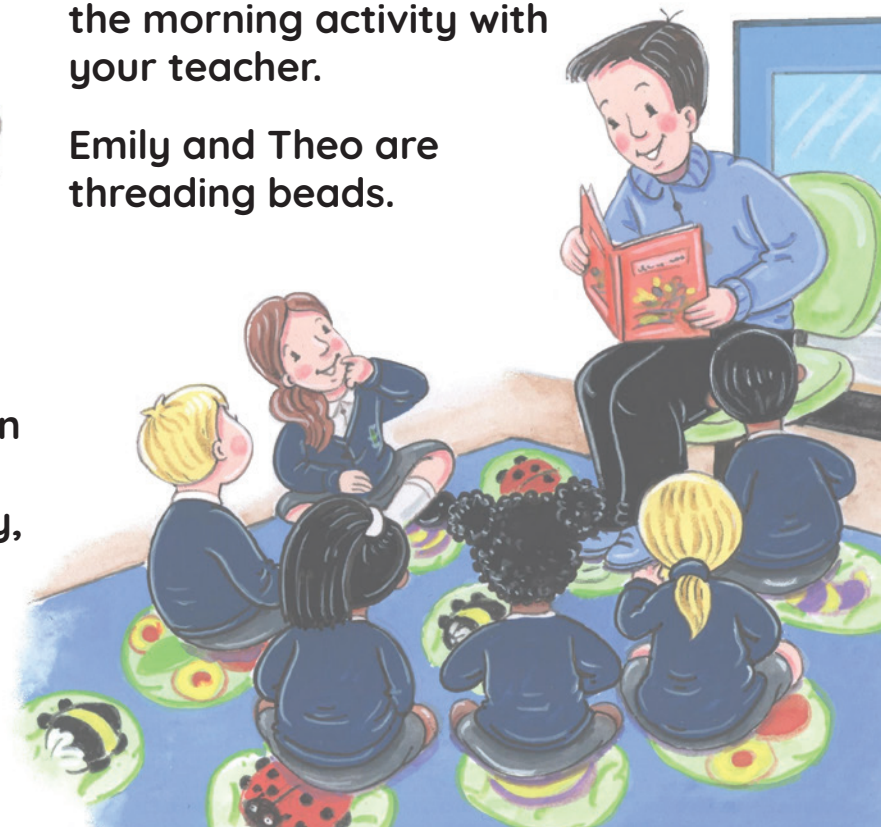


When the bell rings, you will sit on the mat. When your teacher has checked who is in school that day, you will have story time.

There are lots of kind adults in the hall to help you pick your lunch and to help you when you are eating.

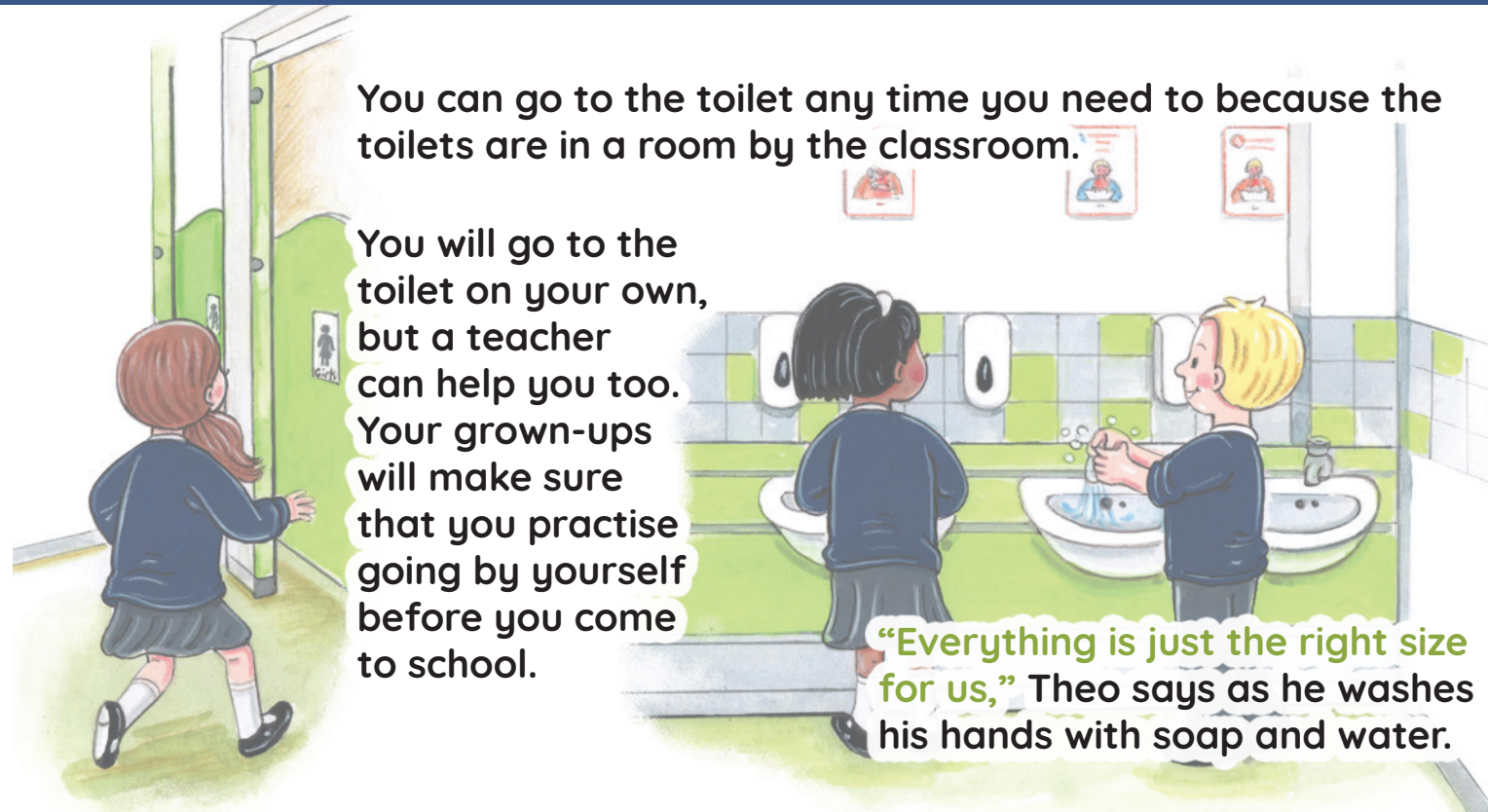


"This food is yummy!" says Ada.
