You will bring a water bottle to school with you every day and you can use it whenever you are thirsty.

At lunchtime, your teacher will take you to the hall for your tasty and healthy meal.

Lunchtime is a very happy time of the day. There will be lots of kind adults to look after you while you eat. Everyone says "please" and "thank you".

The children have collected their meals from the serving area and are now sitting together to eat.

"I'm using my cutlery to eat my food," says Lucy.
"I'm glad I practised using my cutlery at home."

What happens when I need the toilet?

You will go to the toilet by yourself, and you can go whenever you want to. The toilets are close by as they are in a room in your classroom.

Noah has been to the toilet and flushed. Now he is washing his hands with soap and warm water so he doesn't spread germs.

"I am glad that my parents made sure I practised going by myself lots before I came to school," he says. "Now I don't need any help!"
