

What happens when I come to Nursery?

Your grown-ups will bring you in by the pathway next to Victoria Hall and say goodbye to you at the Nursery door. Your friendly teachers will be waiting there to say hello and take you into Nursery.

You will hang up your coat and belongings in the cloakroom area, like Kai and Mia are doing. "I'm glad my parents helped me practise doing this by myself," Kai says. "Now I can get myself dressed and undressed without any help."

Then you will go into the classroom and can choose an activity which your teacher will have got prepared for you.

What will I do in Nursery?

You will have lots of fun learning and making friends as you play.

Sometimes you will do an activity with your teacher and sometimes you can choose what you do.

We have lots of activities indoors and outdoors.

Lara and Kai are making gingerbread men.

"I can't wait to try mine when it's been baked," Lara says.

What will I do outside?



Mia and Kai are playing outside.

"I am going to climb all the way over." Kai says.

"Well done, Kai," the teacher says.

"I'm going to climb too," says Mia.

What if I am hungry or thirsty?

At each Nursery session, you will have a snack and drink water or milk.

If you are at Nursery for lunch, kind grown-ups will look after you while you eat. They will also help you practise using your knife.

"I love my lunch," Lara says.

After lunch, you will go back to Nursery to rest or read so you are ready to start learning again in the afternoon.

What if I need the toilet?



You can go to the toilet when you need to, but remember to put your hand up to let your teacher know when you want to go.

You will go by yourself, so your grown-ups will make sure you practise using the toilet by yourself before you come to Nursery.

"I always flush and then wash my hands with soap and water and dry them," Mia says. She knows that this will stop germs from spreading and keep everyone healthy.

What happens at home time?

At the end of your Nursery session, you will sit on the carpet with your friends and listen to a story or sing songs.

At home time, when your teacher sees your grown-up outside the door, they will tell you that you can go.

"I have had lots of fun today," Lara says to her mum. "I can't wait to tell you all about it!"
