What happens when I arrive at school?

You will be in Olive, Fir or Banyan class. They are named after trees.

Then you will go into the classroom and choose an exciting activity which your teacher will have laid out for you.

What will I do at school?

You will have lots of fun learning and making friends as you play. Some lessons will be with your teacher and classmates, and sometimes

you can choose what you do.




There are lots of activities to do in your classroom.

The children are doing a phonics activity with their teacher and learning about letters and the sounds they make.

"I can see a letter 'm'." Max says. "My name begins with the letter 'M'!" Can you spot it too?

You will choose a library book to take home each week. You will also have a reading book to read at home, with a grown-up, every day.



We want you to be healthy and fit so you will do PE as well.

There is a lot to do outside as well. Nina is riding around on a bicycle.

"I am getting strong muscles and learning to balance," she says.

What happens at lunchtime?

In the morning, you can have a healthy fruit snack and some milk or water. You can take a drink from your own water bottle whenever you are thirsty.

At lunchtime, you will eat in the hall. There are lots of choices, including halal and non-halal food. Your grown-ups will let us know if you have any allergies. There is always a vegetarian choice, and we have a meat-free menu every Monday. Kind adults will look after you while you eat.

"Please may I have the vegetarian choice?" Leo asks the kind adult.

"Would you like some water?" the adult asks. "Yes, please," Nina and Max say.

Everyone uses good table manners and uses their knife, fork and spoon. Try to practise at home, so you feel confident using them all by yourself.

After lunch, you will go out

and play in the playground.

It is shared with Year 1 and

Year 2 children, so there will be lots of friends to meet and

fun games to play.

What if I need the toilet?

You can go when you need to. Just remember to put your hand up to tell your teacher.

The toilet is in your classroom, so it's easy to get to.

Max has flushed and now he is washing his hands with soap and water and will then dry them properly.

"I'm glad I practised going to the toilet by myself at home," he says. "Now it's so easy!"

Sometimes, toilet accidents can happen, so your grown-ups will leave a change of clothes at school for you, just in case.
