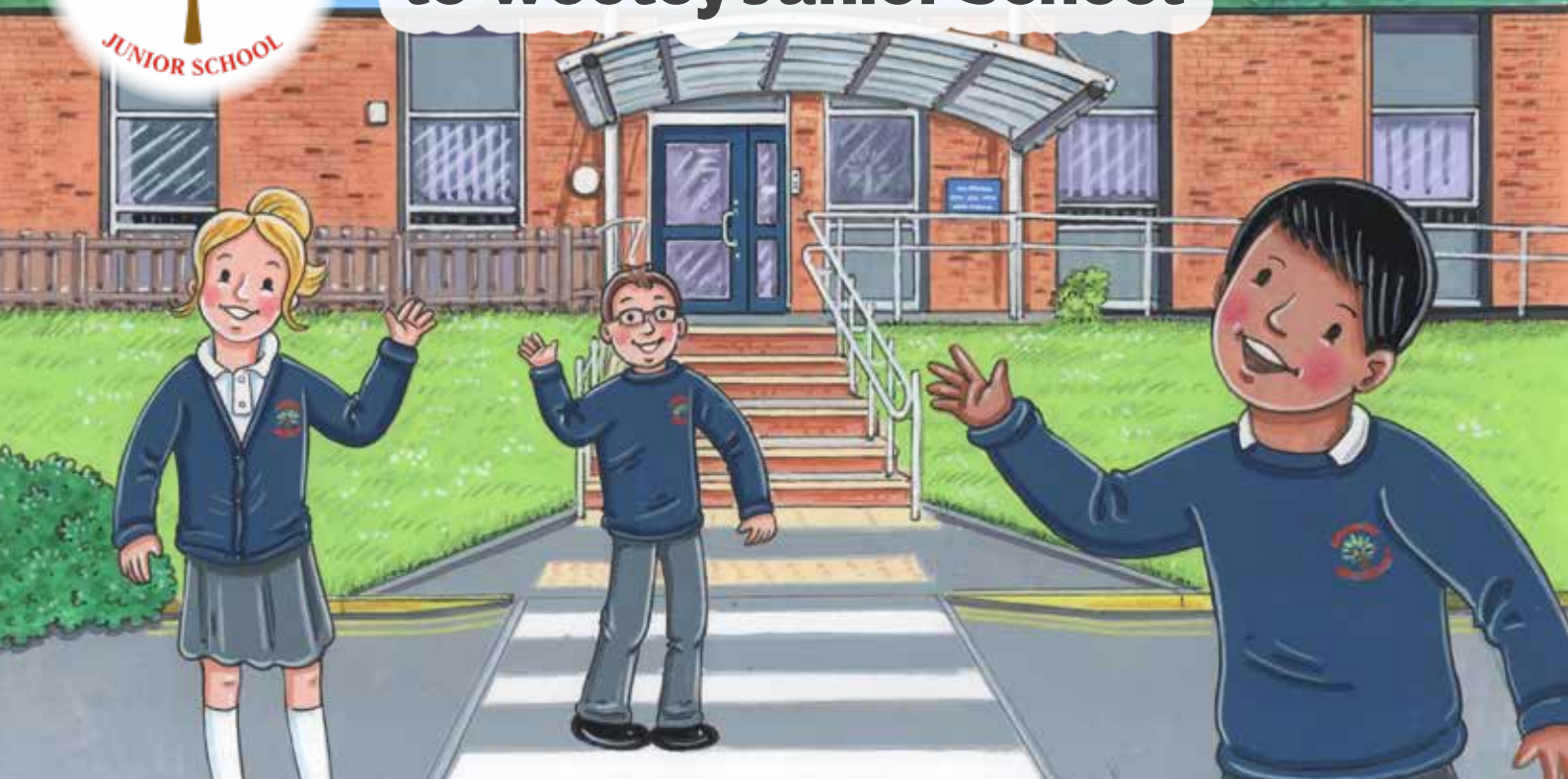


**Ella, Sam and Mo are coming

What work will I do in Year 3?



Your lessons will be exciting and your teacher will encourage you to feel enthusiastic and inspired to learn.

We love reading and will encourage you to do lots of independent reading and help you to develop your vocabulary.

You will learn English, Maths, Science, French, Geography, History, Music, PSHE and PE. You will come to school in your PE kit on days when you have PE.

You will also have regular fun days in Art, DT and RE.



What else will I do in Year 3?

We will encourage independent learning and you will have reading, spelling and times tables homework every week. Some children like to come to Homework club rather than do it at home.

There will be lots of events related to your learning as well. They may involve watching films or videos, role-play activities, school visits, guest speakers, team activities and lots of outdoor learning in our amazing grounds.

You will also go on trips to places such as museums or historical places of interest to support what you will be learning.



What clubs can I do?

There are lots of brilliant clubs that run every day before, during and after school.

If you love sports, you can try multi-sports, cricket, football and running clubs.

We also have coding, chess, art and gardening clubs.

You can learn an individual instrument with music teachers who come to the school. You can have rock and pop music lessons with iRock and even join a band!

You can join the choir. If you were in the Wootey Infant choir, you may have already sung in one of the joint concerts with the Junior School choir.

We also have regular school shows where you can show off your talents.

What will Wootey Junior expect of me?



We have three simple rules:

Be Safe, Be Kind and Be Respectful

At the beginning of the school year, your class will write a 'Class Charter' which lays out what everyone should be doing every day to stick to the rules.

We love rewarding you with stickers when you have done well. You may receive a 'well done' or 'star of the week'... or even a special Headteacher's badge in an assembly where your grown-ups will be invited to watch your proud moment!

Every week the Headteacher will also pick one child in the school who has done really well and deserves to wear a Yellow Jersey for a whole week. We also have lots of Wootey Cups which are awarded each term.

You will be a member of one of our houses, which are **Red Rashford**, **Yellow Brown**, **Green Raducanu** and **Blue Asher-Smith**. You will have lots of fun competing against the other houses in friendly competitions. You may even become House Captain when you are in Year 6.

How will Wootey Junior look after me and my family?

We will look after you and your family when you join us.

When you come to school each morning, your grown-ups can drop you off in your classroom for the first few weeks, so they can get to know your teachers.

You can go to a reading corner if you would like a quiet space. Our reading corners are full of lovely books and cuddly toys.

If you are feeling worried or unhappy, you can speak to any adult at school. You can also ask to speak to Miss Vincent and she will spend time with you in the Butterfly room so you can talk about your worries.

If you don't feel ready to speak to anyone, you can put a note in the Worry Box.
