"My book has some great pictures of horses," Alicja tells her new friends Jack and Rosie.

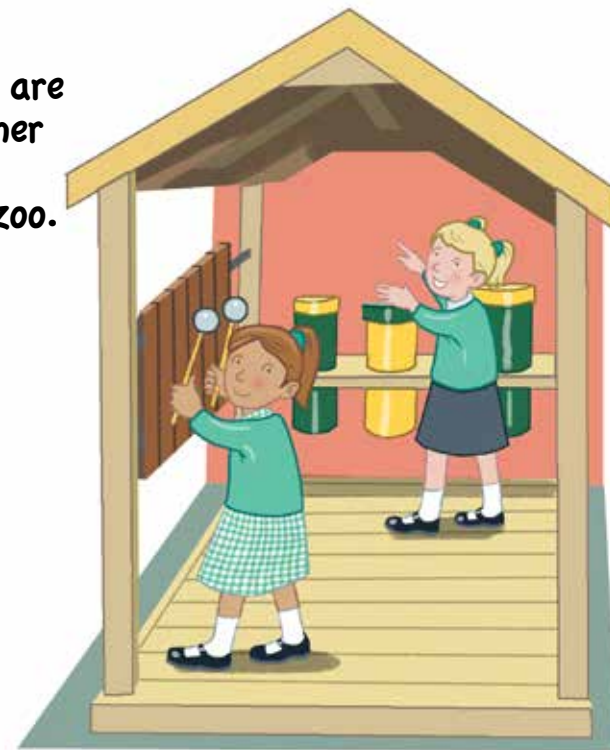
"Would you like some more tea?" Jack asks his friends as they enjoy a tea party.

Your teacher will let you know when your grown-up is here and hand you over to them.

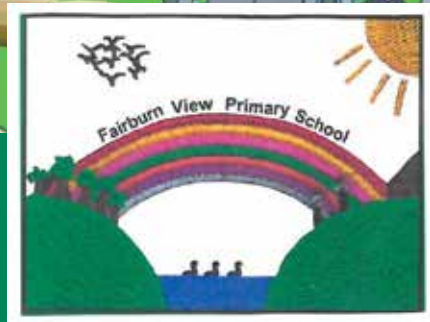
The teacher has seen Alicja's dad and she lets her go to join him.
