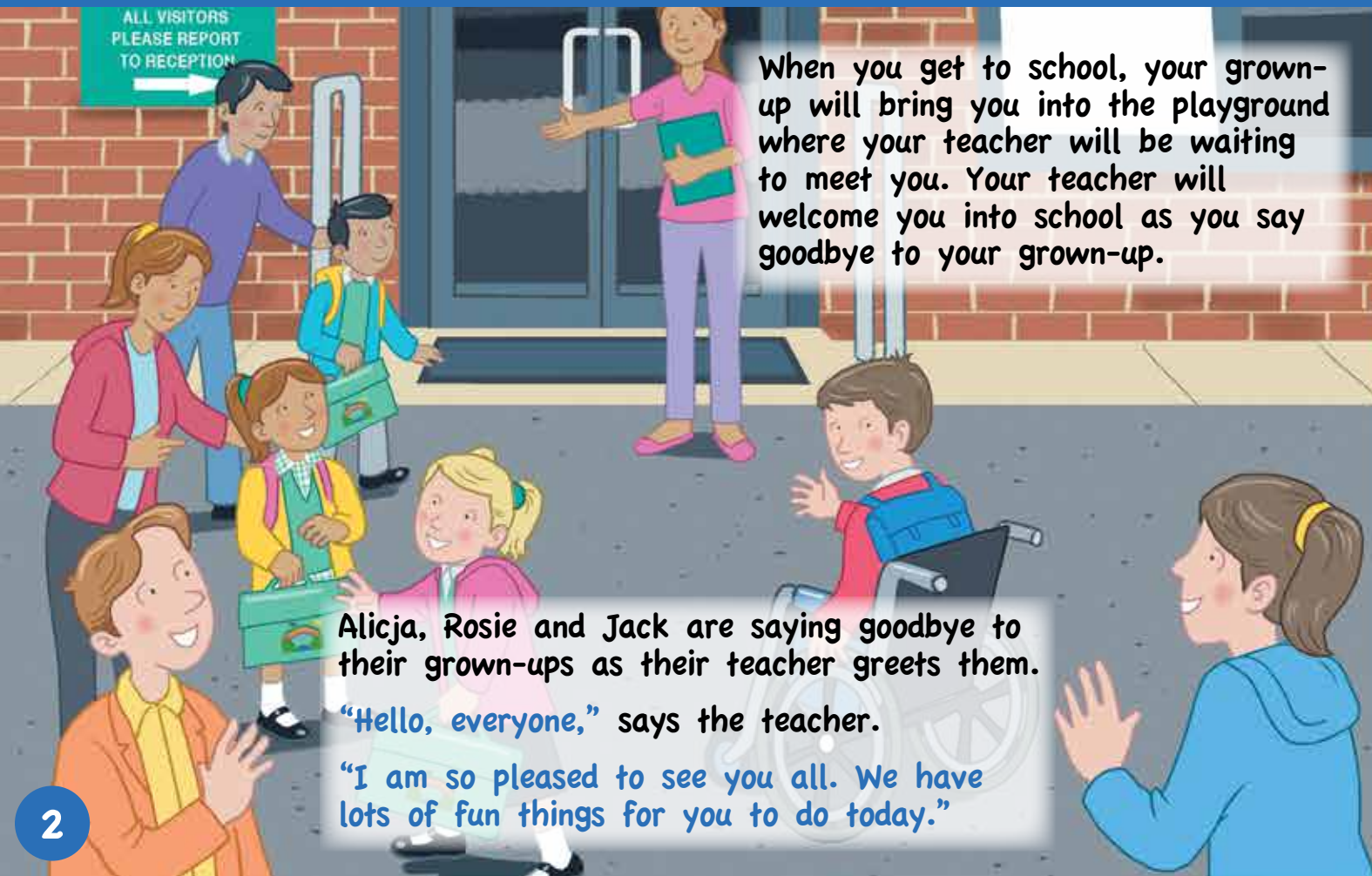


Alicja, Rosie and Jack are excited to be starting in Upper Foundation at Fairburn View Primary School

What happens when I get to school?

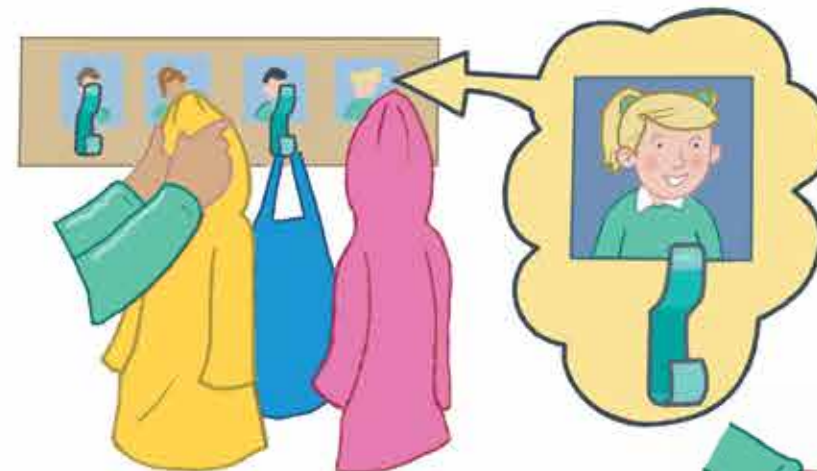

The school will give you a breakfast snack when you arrive each morning.

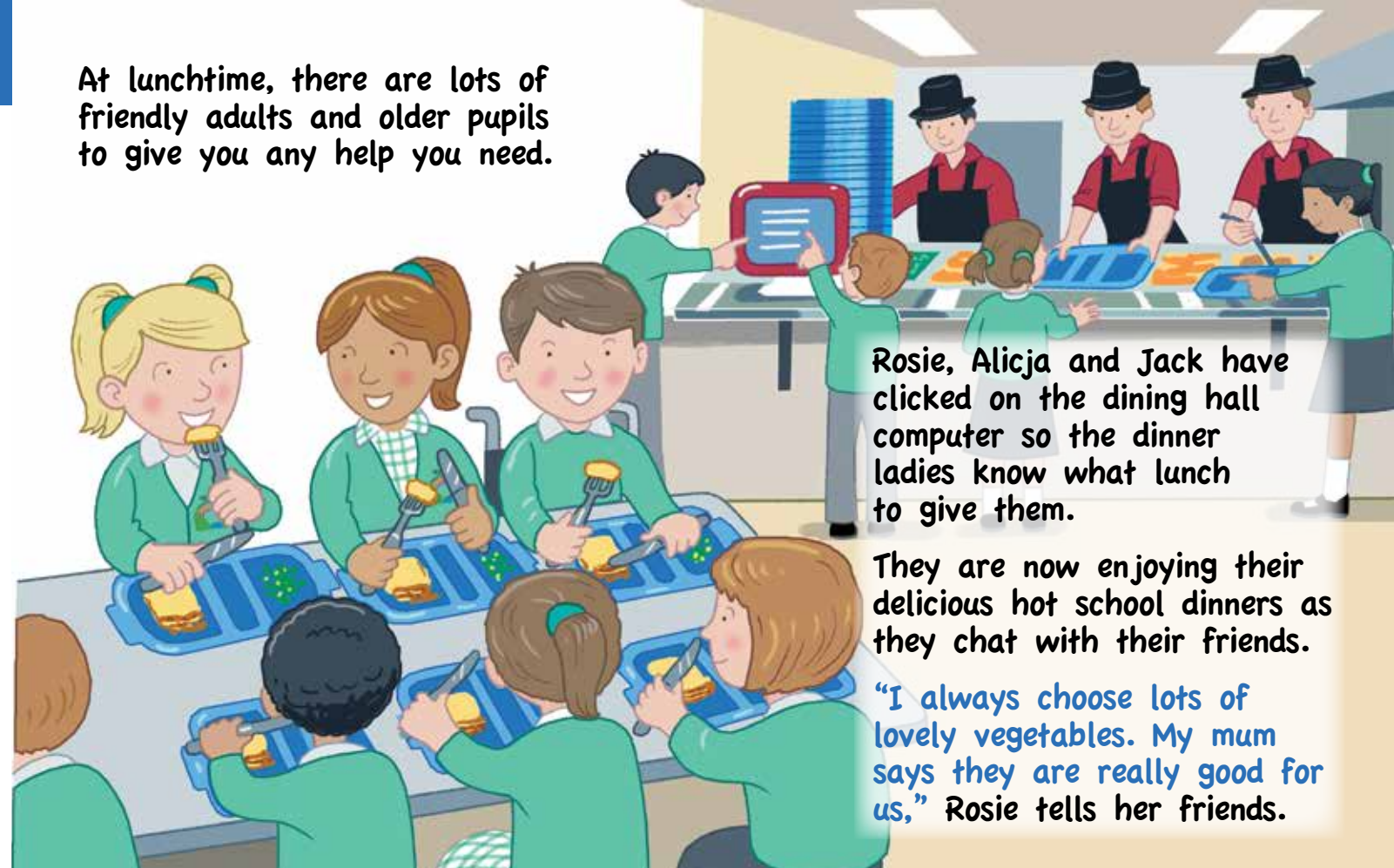
You can have fruit, vegetables and a healthy snack, like a cereal bar. There will be milk and water for you to drink.

Rosie has been practising writing with her teacher. Rosie needs to go to the toilet so she lets her teacher know.

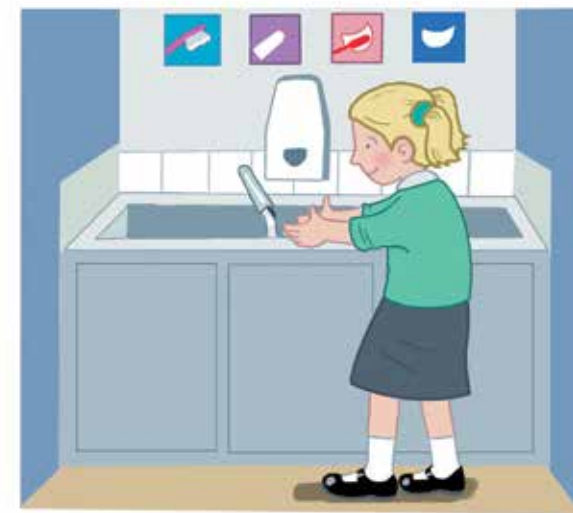
“Please may I go to the toilet?” asks Rosie.

Your teacher will let you know when your grown-up is here and hand you over to them.

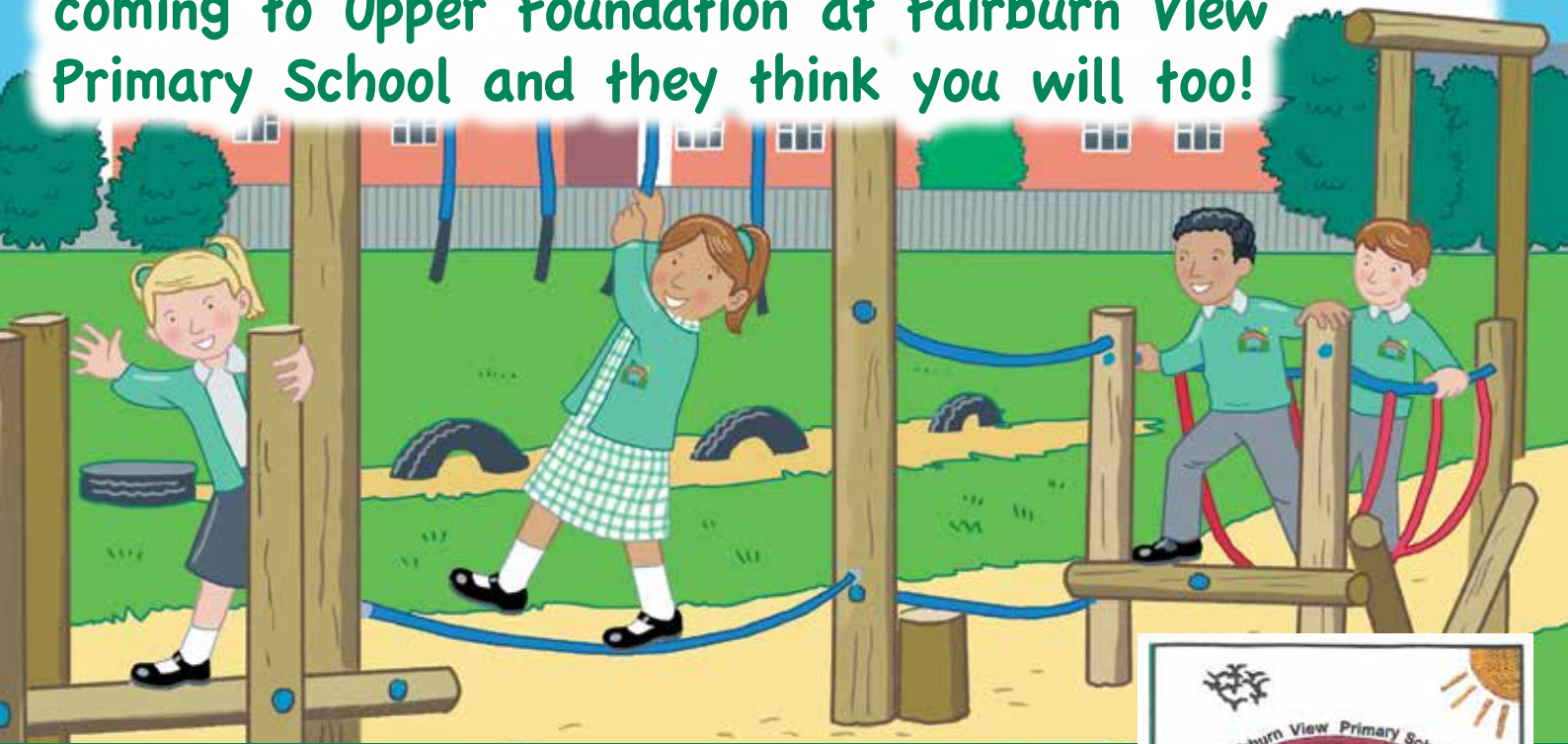
The teacher has seen Alicja's mum and she lets her go to join her.
