"I've found a rocket to play with," says Henry.


"Let's send teddy to the moon!" says Ruby.





What will I do at nursery?



"Has everyone got a snack?" asks the teacher.


"Yes, thank you," the children reply. "My breadsticks are yummy," says Henry.




