You will find a card on the carpet that has your name and photo on. You then post it in the registration box that looks like a red post box. This lets everyone know you are in nursery today!




Are you excited about your first day in nursery?

What will I do in nursery?

At the start of your nursery session, you can choose what you would like to do. We have lots of fun activities for you.

You will also be working with your teacher as they help you practise your reading and writing and other things.

Sameera's teacher is helping her practise her writing. Kofi is playing in the water tray. He is seeing how much water is needed to fill his bowl.

She around on his trike. loves the squelching sound the mud makes. "Look how fast I am going, "I am making a cake for my teddy bear," he calls to his friends Ana she tells her friends. and Sameera.

hummus and pitta bread


- toast

"So is my apple," says Ana.




When Sameera, Ana and Kofi have their coats on and are ready to go home later in the day, their teacher will give them a carton of milk to take home.

What happens if I need the toilet?



Sameera goes to the toilet. When she has finished, she makes sure she flushes to leave the toilet nice and clean for the next child who uses it.

Sameera hops onto the little step that helps her reach the things she needs.

She washes her hands with warm water and soap before drying them. Then she returns to her class.

Sameera is so pleased that she practised going to the toilet on her own at home so she could remember everything once she started nursery.

What happens at home time?

At the end of your session at nursery, you will collect your coat and belongings. Then you join all your new friends on the carpet for a story.

Ana and her friends are listening to the teacher read a lovely story about children going to the zoo. They love looking at the pictures of all the animals!



When your grown-ups arrive, your teacher will let you know and hand you over to them.

"Your grown-ups are here," the teacher tells all the children. "Don't forget to take home your paintings and any other things you have made."

The teacher has seen
Ana's mum and Kofi's dad
and lets them go to join
their grown-ups.

Ana says goodbye to her teacher as she hurries to tell her mum all about her exciting time at nursery.

"Guess what, Mum!" says Ana. "I have made lots of new friends and I have been learning lots of new things."

Ana's mum is pleased Ana's first day has gone so well. She plans to come to the 'Stay and Play' sessions that parents and carers can attend every Friday for twenty minutes of fun joining in with the children.
