



What happens when I get to nursery?

Ben has asked to go to the toilet and his teacher is taking him.


When he has finished, Ben makes sure he flushes to leave the toilet nice and clean for the next child who will use it.

Ben and another classmate, Kim, went to the toilet and they are now washing their hands with warm water and soap. They love the bubbles that help them get their hands really clean.


"Very good," says their teacher. "Now dry your hands and we will go back to the classroom."

What happens at the end of the nursery session?




When it is time to go home, your teacher will let you know when your grown-up is here and hand you over to them.
