What happens when I get to school?

In the morning, you will have maths and English lessons. You will be working in groups and on your own as you learn.

In the afternoon, you will do art and history and look at different topics, such as Fairy Tales and Superheroes.



You will have story time every day and assemblies in the hall every week. Agnes, our reading dog, will sometimes come to story time.

Lily and her friends are having great fun playing lots of different musical instruments.

During the morning, you will have a snack of fresh fruit or vegetables to eat, and water or milk to drink. Fruit and vegetables are delicious and your teacher will encourage you to eat some each day.

What happens if I need the toilet?

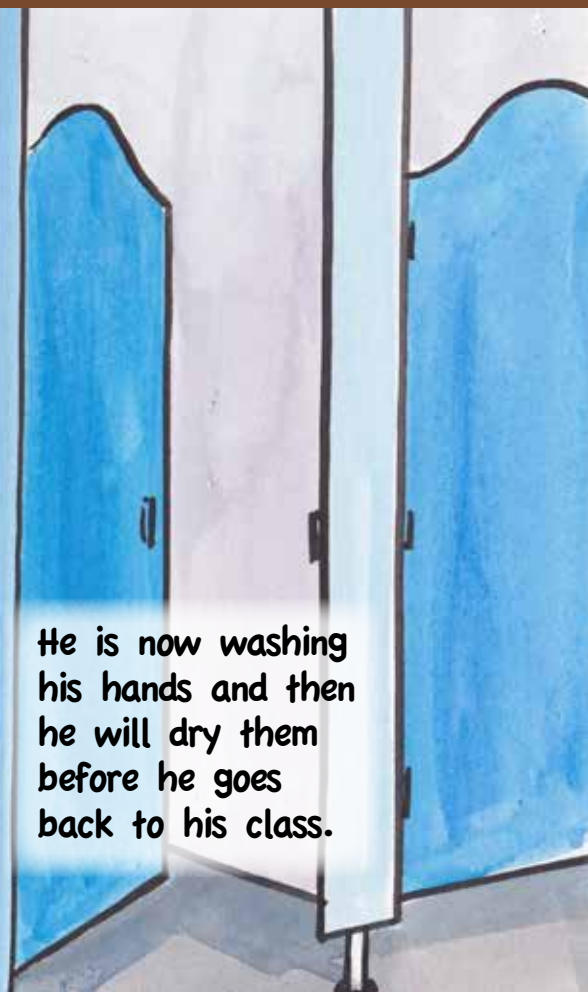
You can go to the toilet when you need to, but you must first let your teacher know.

Henry has asked his teacher if he can go to the toilet.

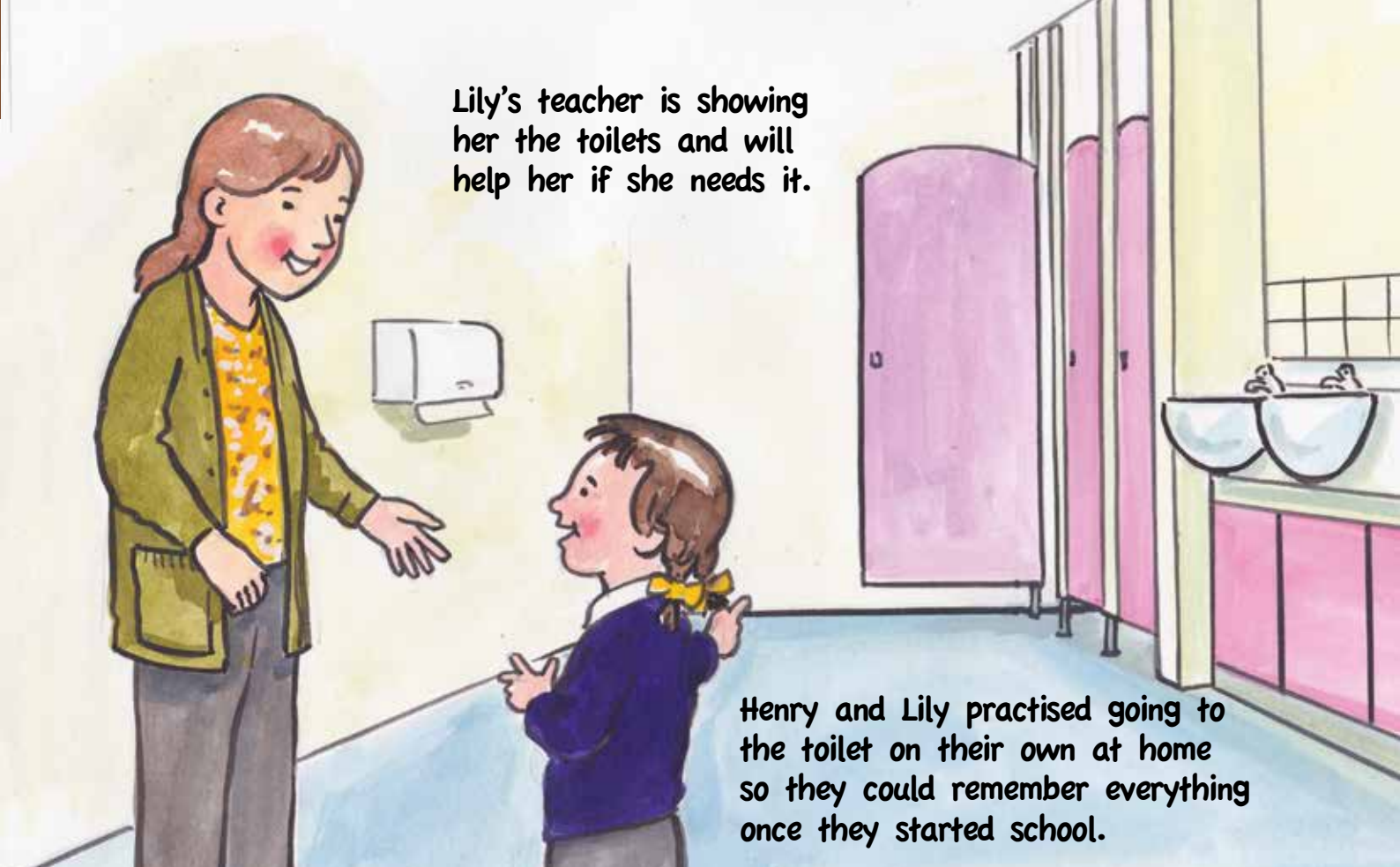
He has been to the toilet and then made sure he flushed to leave the toilet nice and clean.
