What happens if I am hungry or thirsty?

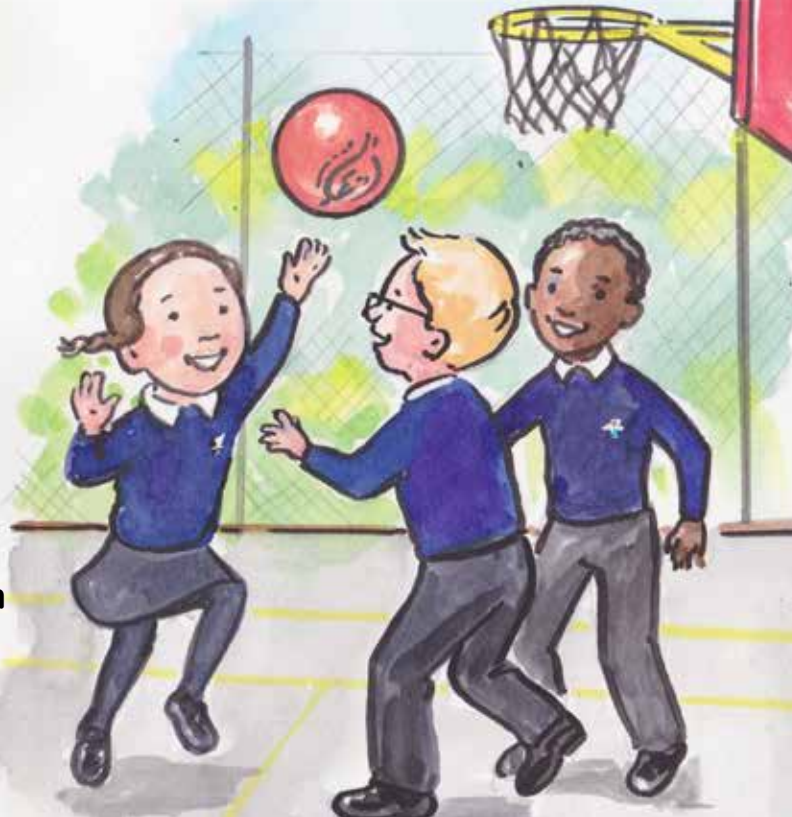
You will take your healthy snack outside at breaktime where you play with your friends. We run a tuck shop where you can buy a healthy snack.

"That chocolate smells so good," Lily says to Ben on their trip to Cadbury World.

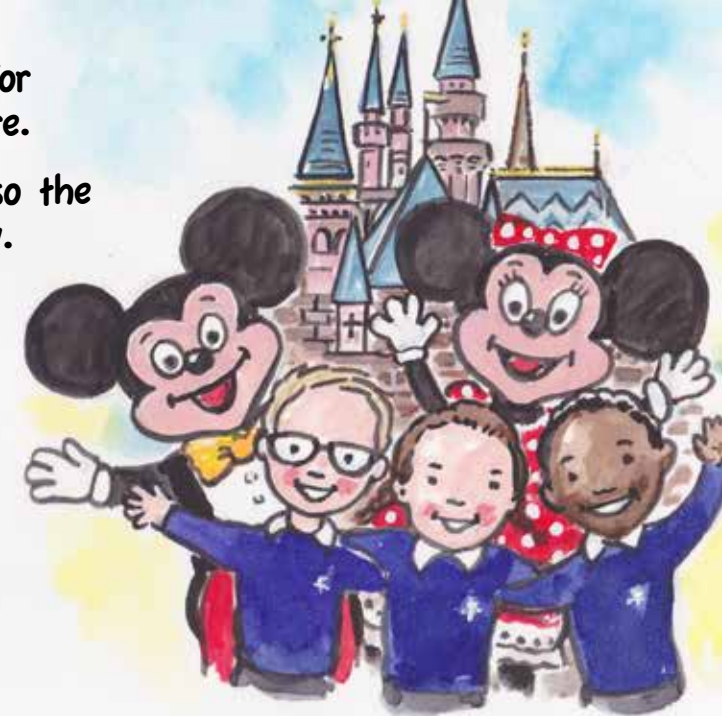
You can also help take care of our animals, such as chickens and rabbits.
