As far as the educational standards are concerned, Laura again has no complaints. "If anything, they are all doing much better than I had hoped or even expected. Joshua's reading skills are amazing, Katy is learning things I would have thought far beyond her age and even Ellie can read and write. I like the fact that the Nursery year prepares them really well for school proper; the emphasis seems to be learning through play but in a fairly structured environment and with resources such as Curiosity Corner. This lets the children explore different aspects of a given subject in a way which suits themselves and seems to be a lovely idea."

Taking a pride in their work

Another major attraction of King's Hedges to Laura is the way that all her children are given work appropriate to their capabilities, so that they neither have to struggle to keep up nor are held back by curriculum restraints. ''If a teacher feels that the children are able to take on something more challenging then they are given the opportunity to do so,'' she explains. ''Joshua loves the Home Learning projects he is given and although these are not compulsory he takes a lot of pride in doing things by himself at home. My only slight concern was for Ellie who, being one of the oldest in her class and very bright, sometimes gets bored with doing things she already knows. Occasionally she will get frustrated by not being allowed to do something new and can get a bit disruptive, but her teachers are aware of her little quirks and handle things very well.''



Looking forward to each new day

Confident that King's Hedges is bringing out the best of her children academically, Laura is also more than happy with the fact that all three really do enjoy their school days. "There's never a time when they look for an excuse not to go, even if they are feeling under the weather or even if we have to walk there in horrible weather! They can't wait to get out of the door in the morning and I am sure that will make their time at King's Hedges even more productive than it already is.
