A change of circumstances

"As a fairly typical young lad, James doesn't always tell me everything but I am confident that if there is anything I need to know, the school will keep me informed."

Celebrating achievement

Whilst Paul is more than happy with his son's academic progress, the pastoral support he receives is, he believes, equally as valuable. "I like the fact that James's teachers are not afraid to challenge him and to push him that bit further when they feel he is capable of just a bit more, and he certainly responds very positively to that challenge. However, James is also a talented sportsman and although he doesn't represent the school, his achievements are celebrated there and he is encouraged to bring in the swimming medals he has won and to take pride in his skills. For me, this shows how much the school cares about the child as a whole person."

Getting the right balance

Paul believes in maintaining a balance between work and play, and that Kingston Park Primary has got it exactly right. "As I see it, James brings home enough work to challenge him but not too much to put him off, and he has ample opportunity to take part in creative subjects as well. The teachers seem to make learning fun and certainly, James has never once had anything bad to say about his school. He might be a boy of few words, but none of them have been negative as far as Kingston Park is concerned!"

Safety, security and happiness

Any parent would want the best possible school experience for their child but for a single parent with limited free time on his hands, Paul values Kingston Park Primary for the all-round support. "I try to get to all James's assemblies and parents' evenings but as I can't be

at the school gates every morning and afternoon I really appreciate the fact that I can trust his teachers to keep him safe, secure and happy.
