What we believe


Christ is at the heart of St Joseph's Catholic Primary School.

Practising our faith in school

Receiving Sacraments

When children are in Year 3, they will prepare to receive their First Holy Communion. This will be done in their parishes. There will also be opportunities for children to attend confession during Lent and Advent.

You will also help prepare your child at home.

The children are proud to be celebrating their First Holy Communion and growing up in the Catholic Faith.



The children are celebrating the Nativity. They have learnt about the Nativity in their lessons and understand how important it is.

Celebrations and Masses

Children celebrate the events that are in the liturgical calendar such as: Lent, Easter, Pentecost, Advent and Christmas. We will teach the children about the importance of them all.

Each term usually begins and ends with a school Mass in St Joseph's church. We also have other Masses throughout the year to celebrate special feasts.

The School Chapel

Our school has a beautiful Chapel on site. Our Chapel is a very special place, which the children love visiting.

Our children are encouraged to use it whenever they want to pray or just have some quiet time to think and reflect.

At lunchtimes, there will always be a member of the Pupil Chaplaincy team in the Chapel. They are Year 5 and Year 6 pupils who can offer help and support to other children.
