How do we help?

- Take time out.
- Listen to you.
- Give you lots of support with your work.


Ella is having a quiet chat with her teacher about how she is feeling. This helps Ella feel better and stay calm. We also help you manage your behaviour in the following ways:

• Adults playing games with you and your friends.

• More staff to help.

- Smaller classes.
- Earning points for rewards.
- Physically keeping you safe.

Ali and his friends are playing a game with their teacher's help. They all know that playing nicely with each other helps them learn ways to stay calm and feel good.

How will you earn points and rewards?




At Littledown School, you will earn points for:

- Completing work.
- Good behaviour.
- Achieving targets.

If you earn enough points, you can attend a reward afternoon. This can be in school, or on a visit out of school.

What happens if I don't get enough points?

You will stay in school and complete one hour of work. You then get a longer Golden Time.

How will the school adults keep you safe?



Sometimes it is hard to stay calm.

If it becomes dangerous, children may need to be held by adults to help them stay safe.

This could happen if someone is being hurt or trying to hurt themselves.

Josh got upset in class and his teachers are holding him safely so he doesn't hurt himself or anyone else.

Josh knows he is safe and soon he will start to feel calm again.



All staff have been trained to hold pupils safely.

Adults will always make sure you are OK and ready to get back to your normal activities.

They will also speak to your family that same day so they know what has happened.

Josh is now feeling calm and his teacher is checking that he feels OK. Then she helps him return to his class.

We speak to your family at least once a week.

We do regular fire drills.

We support you in taking your medication.

We have safe, quiet spaces in school.


We help you resolve arguments with your friends.




We will also teach you about staying safe when you are out of school. So we will give you advice on:
